**Bill Analysis**

SB 195 modifies the Apprenticeships, Internships and Mentorships (AIM) Act of 2016. It directs the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, rather than governing boards of schools, to obtain liability insurance coverage to protect students participating in apprenticeships, internships, and mentorships. It prohibits OMES from directly or indirectly charging a student, his or her parent or legal guardian, or the governing body of a school for the cost of the coverage. It also states that failure of OMES to obtain the coverage cannot be construed as placing a legal liability on the student, his or her parent or legal guardian, or the governing body of the school.
