**Bill Analysis**

SB 2108 strikes the requirement for a person to obtain permission from the Department of Wildlife Conservation to kill feral swine at night and instead requires such a person to obtain permission from the landowner. The measure also authorizes the landowner to control nuisance or damage by feral swine without a permit except during the regular deer season. The measure prohibits the transportation or release of feral swine into the state unless such activities are approved by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry for scientific research or veterinary purposes or such activities include the use of a Judas pig tagging system for the purpose of population control. The measure establishes a \$500.00-\$1,000.00 fine and/or a maximum term of imprisonment of 6 months for persons who violate the provisions of this measure. The measure authorizes the courts to revoke the violator's hunting and fishing license for a period of 1-2 years. Violations involving 10 or more swine shall be classified as a felony offense. The measure repeals language relating to obtaining a permit to hunt feral swine.
