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**Bill Analysis**

SB 2109 requires charitable organizations that engage in executive lobbying or legislative lobbying to file a disclosure with the Ethics Commission if the charitable organization receives one or more contributions totaling \$10,000.00 or more in a calendar year from a foreign principal or principals from funds directed by a foreign principal or principals. Such disclosure shall include the intended or actual use of the contribution and any conditions or directives associated with the contribution. The disclosure must be filed no later than January 31 of each year and any single donation of \$10,000.00 or more must be disclosed within 30 days of its receipt. The Ethics Commission is directed to maintain a publicly accessible online database of all submitted disclosures. The measure imposes a maximum \$25,000.00 fine for noncomplying organizations and provides for the suspension of their right to engage in lobbying or public policy advocacy for up to 1 year if the violation was willful. Contributions made by tribal organizations or to religious organizations shall not be subject to the provisions of this measure.

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
