**Bill Analysis**

SB 2114 authorizes game wardens to take enforcement action as it relates to dogs harassing wildlife on lands without permission upon receiving a complaint from a landowner or a person in lawful control of the land, including the detainment or impoundment of such dogs. The measure prohibits any person from knowingly, recklessly, or negligently allowing a dog owned or kept by them to disturb wildlife on lands the person does not own or have permission to enter. The measure establishes a maximum fine of \$250.00 for each violation. The provisions of the measure shall not apply to dogs engaged in livestock protection or law enforcement animals. Dogs lawfully engaged in hunting activities on lands where permission has been granted shall not be subject to the provisions of this measure.
