**Bill Analysis**

SB 2128 creates the Food Emancipation and Sovereignty Act of 2026. The measure specifies that food that is entirely produced, processed, and sold within the state shall be exempt from federal oversight, licensing, or food inspection. The measure directs the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry to promulgate simplified safety and labeling standards. The measure prohibits any state or local agency from restricting a producer from selling local food directly to consumers provided the transaction occurs wholly within state boundaries. The measure establishes a one-time \$75 fee for the plan review, one-time credential fee, and annual renewal fee.
