**Bill Analysis**

SB 2138 replaces “Controlled” with “Prescribed,” as it relates to the Oklahoma Prescribed Burn Indemnity Fund. The measure prohibit the Fund from allocating monies to a participating landowner for damages incurred on his or her own property. The measure also requires participating landowners to have a written prescribed burn plan and to include contact information, the purpose of the burn, a list of all fire departments or sheriffs’ offices that must be notified, a list of adjoining landowners, a statement of weather conditions, a plan for adequate manpower and firefighting equipment, and an ignition plan for the burn. Notification must be provided to adjoining landowners at least 60 days prior to the burn. The application must be filed with the Oklahoma Conservation Commission at least 30 days prior to the burn. The measure caps the amount that may be paid by the Fund for any 1 event at \$1 million.
