The Department of Corrections shall reimburse any county which is required to retain an inmate pursuant to subsection 14 E F of Section 37 of this title in an amount not to exceed Twenty- 15 seven Dollars (\$27.00) Thirty-two Dollars (\$32.00) per day for each 16 inmate during such period of retention, unless the actual daily cost 17 as determined by the Department of Corrections Daily Rate as defined 18 in this section, exceeds Twenty-seven Dollars (\$27.00) Thirty-two 19 Dollars (\$32.00). If the actual daily cost as determined by the 20 Department of Corrections Daily Rate county exceeds Twenty-seven 21 Dollars (\$27.00) Thirty-two Dollars (\$32.00), the county shall 22 notify the Department of Corrections of the actual daily cost no 23 later than September 30. If the county's actual daily cost is 24

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1 accepted by the Department that, such amount shall be the reimbursement rate for the county beginning the next fiscal year. 2 If the Department rejects the county's actual daily cost 3 application, then the actual daily cost reimbursement shall be 4 5 determined by the State Auditor and Inspector and shall be imposed beginning the next fiscal year. The Department shall distribute the 6 reimbursement on a monthly basis upon receipt and approval of a 7 billing statement from the county. The county shall use the 8 9 reimbursement to defray expenses of equipping and maintaining the 10 jail and payment of personnel. The provisions in this act shall be implemented by the Department to allow sufficient time for 11 12 application to FY-2019. The Department of Corrections shall 13 reimburse the county for the emergency medical care for physical injury or illness of the inmate retained under this act section if 14 the injury or illness is directly related to the incarceration and 15 the county is required by law to provide such care for inmates in 16 17 the jail. The Department shall not pay fees for medical care in excess of the rates established for Medicaid providers. 18 The state shall not be liable for medical charges in excess of the Medicaid 19 scheduled rate. The Director Department may accept any inmate 20 required to have extended medical care upon application of the 21 county. 22

23 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.24
