Bill Summary and Fiscal Analysis:

HB 1001 would add the crime of accessory to murder to the list of 85% crimes. The DOC has provided that the average sentence length for an individual convicted of this crime is 3396 days (9.3 years), though the average time served by these individuals is 1110 days (3.04 years). Based on the current average sentence, the average time served would increase to 2886 days (7.9 years). This would be an increase of 1776 days (4.87 years) of time served. However, this does not consider how the measure could affect sentencing or plea agreements when all parties are aware that any individual convicted shall serve 85% of their sentence. It should also be noted that any cost increase to the state or the Department would not be realized until after the current average time served of 1110 (3.04 years) has passed, and it would also be dependent on future convictions and sentence lengths.
