Bill Summary and Fiscal Analysis:

HB 1005 directs Service Oklahoma to develop a voter identification card that includes a photograph of the person to whom the card is issued. The measure provides that for any election conducted after January 1, 2027 each voter shall be required to present a photo ID that satisfies all requirements of “proof of identity”. The measure also provides that the voter ID developed by Service Oklahoma shall be provided free of charge. Service Oklahoma is unable to determine the amount of the voting population that would request and/or need the voter identification card, as many of the photo IDs registered voters already possess would meet the requirements of this measure. The agency notes that the printing cost per credential would be \$2.00, and the total yearly cost would be dependent on the amount of cards issued.

The Oklahoma State Election Board states there may be additional costs associated with implementation and updating training materials, but any cost would be minimal and absorbable by the Board’s budget.
