**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

This bill creates Rain's Law. It requires school districts to annually provide research-based instruction related to fentanyl abuse prevention and drug poisoning awareness to students in sixth through twelfth grades. It allows the instruction to be provided by an organization or an employee or agent of an organization. It directs the State Department of Education to identify and adopt curriculum standards for the instruction, which are to be incorporated into the appropriate health standards for sixth through twelfth grades. The measure states that if a school district offers a health education class for such grade levels, it must include fentanyl awareness curriculum.

This bill has no fiscal impact.
