**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

This bill adds computer science or a one year, full-time, three hour career and technology program leading to an industry credential or certificate or college credit. It also requires that a personal financial literacy course to be taken prior to graduation. This credit may be fulfilled through an AP course whose content addresses the required concepts. It requires four units or sets of competencies in mathematics. The bill also states that a school district may issue an alternate diploma to certain students under certain circumstances.

This bill has no fiscal impact.
