Bill Summary and Fiscal Analysis:

This bill creates the Emerson Kate Cole Act. It requires a school employee to contact 911 as soon as possible in the event Epinephrine is administered to a student. It also requires the school district to notify the parent or guardian of a student who experiences a possible allergic reaction as soon as possible. The bill directs the State Board of Education's model policy on self-treatment and self-administration of certain medications to include at a minimum required annual training for teachers and school employees who are directly responsible for students on the topics of food allergies, recognizing anaphylaxis and instruction on administering Epinephrine.

This bill has no fiscal impact.
