Bill Summary and Fiscal Analysis:

HB 2422 establishes provisions a convicted sex offender who meets certain criteria including hormonal treatment shall be eligible for parole. If the offender ceases the hormonal treatment, received another treatment to reverse the hormonal treatment, or commits subsequent offenses, they are be imprisoned and no longer eligible for parole. If the offender committed a subsequent offense, they shall be sentenced to life without parole.

DOC would absorb the cost of the hormonal treatment in its current budget and may realize savings from fewer inmates behind the fence.
