**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1214 requires school district boards of education to adopt a policy regarding sex trafficking and exploitation prevention and education programs for students. It requires boards of education to provide schoolwide programs to 6th -12th grade students and staff. The bill directs the State Department of Education to develop the curriculum as a stand-alone unit that is age appropriate with an emphasis on exploitation prevention. It requires the curriculum for 9th through 12th grade students to address certain topics. The measure also directs the Department to develop and make available to public schools that serve 6th -12th grades a stand-alone curriculum on social media and how students can protect themselves when using social media.
