Bill Summary and Fiscal Analysis:

SB1230 amends existing driver license and identification card provisions to require Service Oklahoma to verify the lawful presence in the United States of applicants for original REAL ID Noncompliant Driver Licenses and Identification Cards. Lawful presence must be verified through the federal Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) Program operated by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security or an equivalent designated program. The measure also directs Service Oklahoma to provide notary services at no cost to the applicant and establishes felony penalties for knowingly lying about lawful presence.

If interpreted to require SAVE verification only when immigration documents are presented, the bill would codify existing practice and result in no fiscal impact related to SAVE verification. If interpreted more broadly, the operational and fiscal impact cannot be determined at this time. The notary requirement could impact transaction processing times and staffing needs. Even a modest increase of a few minutes per transaction, when applied across approximately 1.2 million annual credentialing transactions, would result in tens of thousands of additional processing hours statewide. The total fiscal impact cannot be determined at this time and would depend on implementation and operational decisions.
