**Bill Summary and
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1232 creates a felony offense for any person who enters any premises with the intent of stealing or removing any copper wire, cable, or tubing if such theft results in damages equal to or more than \$100,000. Such persons will be subject to a fine of up to \$50,000 or a term of imprisonment equal to the penalty provisions of Class C2 felony offenses.

The Department of Corrections notes any incarceration increases would be dependent on the number of future convictions, and the agency is unable to determine a fiscal impact. The Department has provided the marginal/incremental cost of an incarcerated inmate, which is \$67.26 per day or \$24,549.90 per year.
