**Bill Summary and
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1245 removes perjury from the list of crimes that are classified as C2 felonies. The measure also removes the 10-year limit on second and subsequent driving under the influence violations and the 10-year limit on deferred judgements as they relate to second and subsequent felony convictions. The measure also strikes the \$100 assessment that gets deposited into the Drug Abuse Education and Treatment Revolving Fund.

The measure yields a minimal fiscal impact to the Department of Mental Health. Based on FY'25 activity, the Drug Abuse Education and Treatment Revolving Fund collected \$354,000, which is equivalent to less than 1% of DMH's budget. Given the length of time involved, historical data does not provide a reliable basis for estimating current or future impact to the Oklahoma Department of Corrections; therefore, a fiscal impact cannot be determined at this time.
