Bill Summary and Fiscal Analysis:

SB1361 amends Title 47 to require that veterans, active-duty members of the Armed Forces, and active-duty members of the Oklahoma National Guard not be charged a fee for the issuance, replacement, or renewal of an Oklahoma driver license or state identification card. The measure expands current law, which limits fee exemptions to veterans certified by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs as 100% permanently disabled, to include all veterans, active-duty military personnel, and active-duty National Guard members.

This measure would newly extend fee exemptions to an estimated 244,436 veterans who are not currently eligible for free issuance, renewal, or replacement of a driver license. Because precise expiration and renewal cycle data are not available for this population, SOK assumes that 25% of newly eligible veterans will renew or replace a driver license in a given fiscal year. This results in an estimated 61,109 veteran transactions annually. SOK assumes that the bill applies to all active duty and traditional National Guard members, resulting in a combined eligible population of approximately 27,921 service members as well. The combined estimated annual revenue reduction associated with this measure is therefore approximately \$4.35 million per fiscal year. Because the effective date of the measure is November 1, 2026, the first fiscal year of implementation would include approximately eight months of impact, resulting in an estimated revenue reduction of approximately \$2.9 million in the initial fiscal year.
