**Bill Summary and
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1381 states that a defendant who has been arrested with or without a warrant for a criminal offense must be brought before a judge no later than 48 hours after being taken into custody. The measure also states that the court must appoint counsel if the defendant is unable to secure a defense attorney and authorizes the court to impose conditions on release.

The fiscal impact that the measure has to the District Courts for the first year of implementation is \$8,733,637, with costs related to new hardware in the courtrooms in each county, software support, and storage. The annual recurring fiscal impact is \$9,065,954, with costs related to ongoing hardware and software support, along with one audiovisual FTE, one service desk FTE, and 77 courtroom facilitators. The measure has an annual fiscal impact of at least \$7,636,626 to the District Attorney's Council, with costs including hiring 54 additional ADAs at \$113,471 per ADA and 27 additional support staff at \$55,896 per support employee. The fiscal impact for the DAC does not include the potential need for additional judges, as this number could fluctuate based on the volume of cases. The measure has an annual fiscal impact of \$4,823,000 to the Oklahoma Indigent Defense System, with costs including hiring 15 additional trial attorneys, additional support staff, funds to expand the office space to be able to hold the new staff, additional training and recruitment, and private attorney contracts.
