**Bill Summary and
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1445 modifies criminal penalties for any person convicted of tearing down barricades or entering a closed area on a highway or road during a flood if the action resulted in a death. The measure also states that a person under the age of 18 would be guilty of first-degree manslaughter and a person over 18 years of age would be guilty of second-degree manslaughter in relation to the provisions of the measure.

The Department of Corrections notes any incarceration increases would be dependent on the number of future convictions, and the agency is unable to determine a fiscal impact. The Department has provided the marginal/incremental cost of an incarcerated inmate, which is \$67.26 per day or \$24,549.90 per year.
