**Bill Summary and
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1460 states that second and subsequent offenses relating to looking at a person in a clandestine manner or using recording equipment in a clandestine manner will be classified as B5 offenses. Those convicted of second or subsequent B5 offenses will be subject to a term of imprisonment not to exceed 5 years and/or a maximum fine of \$5,000.

The Department of Corrections notes any incarceration increases would be dependent on the number of future convictions, and the agency is unable to determine a fiscal impact. The Department has provided the marginal/incremental cost of an incarcerated inmate, which is \$67.26 per day or \$24,549.90 per year.
