**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1467 requires any criminal justice agency to share all criminal justice data and records with a bona fide researcher upon request of the data. The measure states that the releasing of the data and information will not be construed as a release of data to the public for the purposes of the Oklahoma Open Records Act. The Attorney General will give assistance to criminal justice agencies including a process for identifying bona fide researchers and sharing criminal justice data, records, and information with the researchers.

The fiscal impact of this measure is \$100k-\$300k as the Attorney General is anticipating a need of employing 0.5 to 1.0 FTE for a paralegal, 0.5 FTE for attorney oversight of providing data, and 0.5 FTE for an attorney to provide advice to outside agencies.
