**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1474 requires the Corporation Commission to levy an annual surface impact fee of \$25.00 per acre for any surface disturbance associated with oil and gas operations on agricultural land, and a produced water impact fee of \$0.01 per barrel of any produced water generated within the state. Acres restored to agricultural use within 12 months or used for multi-use grazing under an approved surface-use conservation plan shall not have a fee assessed. The proposal also creates the Water and Agricultural Protection Revolving Fund for the testing of groundwater and rural drinking water systems connected with pollution concerns from a well, soil and land restoration for farms and ranches affected by oil and gas operations, plugging and reclaiming abandoned wells, and technical assistance and water recycling research programs.

The Corporation Commission shares an approximate fiscal impact of \$1,060,139. Three (3) FTE are estimated to be needed in support of this proposal – 2 program managers and an administrative FTE with an estimated fiscal impact of \$310,169. Two (2) IT systems would need to be developed – one for locations and one for water production – at a cost of approximately \$750,000. They estimate the IT costs based on development costs associated with expanding the OKIES system to include the required forms and collection of fees.
