**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1536 authorizes the Attorney General to exercise their investigative powers when a person believes an entity is involved in fraudulent charitable solicitation to or is providing resources to a foreign terrorist organization. If the Attorney General finds the organization has provided any support to a foreign terrorist organization, the Attorney General will notify the Governor that the entity is a Designated Terrorist Support Entity, and they will be denied all state funding. The measure also directs the Attorney General to submit a report annually to the Legislature and Governor designations issued, judicial actions filed, and amounts of fraudulently solicited funds recovered or prevented.

The measure appropriates \$1 million from the General Revenue Fund to the Office of the Attorney General and \$250,000 to the Governor's office. The Office of the Attorney General does not anticipate a need for further resources.
