**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1584 changes the time frame that sexual assault evidence kits, or other DNA evidence if a kit is not collected, must be sent to the appropriate accredited crime laboratory for forensic testing from 20 day to 10 days after obtaining the evidence by a law enforcement agency, unless the victim requests that the sexual assault evidence kit not be tested. This measure also states that the kits collected must be processed by the crime laboratory that it was submitted to within 30 days of receiving the kit.

This measure yields no fiscal impact.
