Bill Summary and Fiscal Analysis:

SB 1615 modifies the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program (OHLAP), also known as Oklahoma's Promise. It expands eligibility to children of certified administrators who apply for participation beginning in the 2026-27 school year. It defines "certified administrator" as someone who has been a certified, full-time superintendent or principal who has been employed as a certified classroom teacher, a superintendent, or a principal for a minimum of 10 years prior to the child applying.

The Regents anticipate additional staffing costs of approximately \$800,000 annually for application review, correspondence, and program management. In addition, the Regents estimate need for an additional \$240,018,102 in the first year of the expanded eligibility, \$338,589,381 in the second year, \$424,755,394 for the third year, \$488,587,293 for year four, and \$507,194,885 in year five. This is a total impact of \$2,003,145,055 over five years.
