**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1664 directs the Supreme Court to implement rules governing the use of audio and video recording, broadcasting, and livestreaming systems in all courts in the state. The measure requires records to be retained for at least 10 years or the duration of a case, whichever is longer, and requires the establishment of an online portal for the public to access broadcasts and recordings. The measure states that funding for the system should be secured by legislative appropriations and authorizes the use of funds in the Oklahoma Court Information System Revolving Fund to secure equipment.

The fiscal impact of the measure for the first year of implementation is \$28,559,074 with costs including hardware costs and initial software setup and support. The annual recurring fiscal impact is \$73,789,974 consisting of costs related to hardware support, software support, live captioning and additional personnel to operate and maintain the provisions of the measure.
