Bill Summary and Fiscal Analysis:

SB 1667 directs the State Election Board to update the voter registration form to require applicants to fill in a space with the identification number on their driver's license and directs the election board to use all available resources to verify the applicant is a citizen of the United States. The measure requires federal-only voters to vote in person, allows them to only vote in federal elections, and directs the State Election Board to send written notice to every federal-only voter who submitted a ballot in that election informing the voter of the disposition of his or her ballot.

The fiscal impact of this measure is at least \$100,000, with \$50,000 allocated to programming and \$50,000 allocated to printing and mailing. The State Election Board would need to request programming for the election software to create two categories for federal-only voters and other verified voters. The software would need to be updated to separate precinct registries to differentiate between verified voters and federal voters at the polling place and to design and distribute written notices of the disposition of ballots and a notice to all federal-only voters who appeared to vote. The State Election Board will also be required to redesign and reprint provisional ballot materials to include federal-only voters. The emergency on the measure may impose a cost to receive the provisional ballots as a rush print.
