**Bill Summary and
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1673 creates the Prosthetic Access and Accountability Act 2026. The measure requires each health benefit plan that includes covered prosthetic benefits to provide the restoration of physical function to the greatest extent possible. The proposal provides that denials based on cost shall be rendered invalid if the physician-prescribed device was prescribed to meet documented functional needs. A plan denying or delaying a prescribed device shall be liable for personal injury, financial loss, or harm caused by the denial or delay. A \$5,000 fine per violation and a daily penalty of \$1,000 for delays is established. Coverage for prostheses and orthoses are required to be reviewed within 2 business days if marked urgent by the prescribing provider and 10 business days for standard requests.

The Oklahoma Health Care Authority estimates a fiscal impact of approximately \$600,000 annually, potentially affecting up to 600 members. The cost risk could fluctuate greatly and is driven by both utilization uncertainty and the unpredictability of the cost of additional services. A fiscal impact to Medicaid is pending.
