#### **Bill Summary and Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1702 creates the Firearm Preservation Act and states that any firearm that has been obtained through a court-ordered turnover, estate settlement, or other method of acquisition by the state will be disposed of by auction. The proceeds from the auction will be allocated to the law enforcement agency that conducted the auction. Any law enforcement agency that conducts an action shall maintain records of all auctioned firearms and such records will be retained for a period of no less than 5 years. If any law enforcement agency violates the provisions of the measure, they are subject to a \$500 fine for the first offense and \$1,000 for the second and following offenses.

The fiscal impact of the measure is possible increase to fines.
