**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB176 requires health benefits plans to offer coverage for enrollees to obtain a three-month supply of a contraceptive drug at once the first time the enrollee obtains a drug, and a six-month supply at once each subsequent time the enrollee obtains the same drug. The proposal also clarifies that the enrollee can request a smaller supply of the contraceptive drug and that the prescribing provider may prescribe a smaller supply if the prescription is supported by clinical utility and medical appropriateness.

The Oklahoma Health Care Authority states that a fiscal impact would be negligible.
