**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1762 creates the Oklahoma Protection of Fundamental Rights and Public Policy Act which prohibits any person from inflicting or threatening to inflict any form of mutilation. The measure further prohibits female genital mutilation and establishes a penalty for any person convicted of female genital mutilation. Such person will be subject to a term of imprisonment of 1-5 years and/or a maximum fine of \$20,000.

The Department of Corrections notes any incarceration increases would be dependent on the number of future convictions, and the agency is unable to determine a fiscal impact. The Department has provided the marginal/incremental cost of an incarcerated inmate, which is \$67.26 per day or \$24,549.90 per year.
