**Bill Summary and
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1937 prohibits an employer from receiving an economic development incentive if the employer voluntarily grants recognition rights for its employee on the basis of signed union authorization cards if the selection of a bargaining representative is conducted through secret ballot election conducted by the NLRB, discloses employee contact information to labor organizations, signs a neutrality agreement with a labor organization, or requires a subcontractor to engage in activities prohibited by the proposal. Violations of the proposal may be reported to the Attorney General and may result in the repayment of all economic development incentives received over the life of the project. The measure does not apply to agreements between the state and an employer where the employer has already entered into a collective bargaining agreement with a labor organization, or which a secret ballot election has already occurred.

The return of economic development incentives is contingent on an employer voluntarily granting recognition rights for its employees. It is unknown which entities pursuing or receiving economic development incentives from the state would voluntarily grant recognition rights to its employees. The fiscal impact is indeterminable.
