**Bill Summary and
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB1962 removes exemptions in 74 O.S. 85.3A and 74 O.S. 85.12 and instead allows the State Purchasing Director to determine appropriate entity exemptions and refer such determinations to the legislature to adopt a joint resolution approving or disapproving those determinations. It additionally requires entities who receive an exemption to provide a report each fiscal year to Central Purchasing that their exemption reduced costs and increased efficiency for the effected entity.

OMES anticipates the requirement to gather reports from each agency and to review those and make determinations on which entities should have exemptions will likely require one additional FTE to perform review and analytics. The estimated cost for one additional employee fully burdened is \$84,500 annually. Agencies who would have their exemptions removed will also possibly experience a fiscal impact; each would likely need to hire a Certified Procurement Officer to operate under the Central Purchasing Act effectively.
