**Bill Summary and
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 1963 creates the Military Installation and Critical Infrastructure Protection Act of 2026 which prohibits any foreign principal from a foreign adversary country to have an interest greater than 25% in an entity that owns agricultural land in the state. The measure also prohibits any government or private entity constructing or having access to critical infrastructure from entering into an agreement relating to such infrastructure with a qualifying entity and requires any company accessing critical infrastructure to provide certification to the Attorney General showing all employee positions that have access to such infrastructure. The measure establishes a maximum fee of \$150 for the Attorney General to administer provisions of this measure relating to the certification.

The Attorney General is anticipating a cost of \$300,000 for hiring an additional attorney and support staff to make the determinations of entities subject to the provisions of this act. The fiscal impact of this measure for FY'27 is \$200,000 and is prorated based on 8 months of the fiscal year given the effective date of November 1st. The fiscal impact of the measure every year thereafter is \$300,000.
