**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 2062 states that a person who is ordered to self-report to a correctional facility may bypass county jail and be directed to the Department of Corrections for processing and initial assessments. The sheriff or detention center will not be responsible for transportation in such cases and will not be eligible for reimbursement.

Although placement would still require custody, risk, health, and mental health assessments, these evaluations could be conducted remotely by DOC staff if necessary. Each assessment would require involvement from a case manager, a qualified mental health professional, and a medical provider, with each evaluation typically requiring approximately one hour. Historically, similar arrangements have occurred on a limited basis, approximately four times annually. Considering salary and benefit costs, the estimated expense to deploy a case manager, psychological clinician, and registered nurse to conduct remote assessments for an eight-hour day, four times per year, the estimated fiscal impact is up to \$8,300 annually, which is expected to be absorbed within existing resources.
