#### **Bill Summary and Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 2169 directs the Commissioners of the Land Office (CLO) to identify and prioritize trust lands that have been harmed and devalued by invasive woody species by December 15 of each year and submit a management plan to the Oklahoma Conservation Commission (OCC). The Commission is authorized to enter programs run by and coordinate with the OCC, other state or federal agencies, vendors, or its lessees, for the removal and management of species. The CLO is authorized to use up to \$1,000,000 per year for the removal of invasive woody species, and may receive resources through coordination with the OCC or other state agencies.

Any potential fiscal impact would cost up to \$1,000,000 to the agency's revolving funds, as determined by the proposal. There is no fiscal impact to the General Fund. There is no fiscal impact on the OCC.
