Bill Summary and Fiscal Analysis:

SB 273 expands the timeframe a person may vote with an in-person absentee ballot to include the Saturday of each of the 3 weeks immediately preceding a General Election Primary Election, or Presidential Primary Election, as well as the Wednesday immediately preceding the named elections. The measure also directs the secretary of a county election board with a county with more than 25,000 registered voters to designate 1 polling location per 15,000 voters for in-person absentee polling. Based on both the additional days of in-person absentee voting and polling sites needed to meet the provisions of this measure, the Oklahoma State Election Board states an additional \$1,182,546 would be needed per statewide election. This impact does not consider the additional expenses for additional staff and polling site rentals that will be incurred by the counties.
