**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 55 increases the minimum wage for state employees to \$13.00 an hour, increasing \$0.50 per year over a five-year period after the effective date of the measure or the current federal minimum wage, whichever is greater.

The Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) estimates a fiscal impact of \$395,329.48 for the first year. This calculation was made using state employee workforce data from January 1, 2025. This figure does not include national guard, board members, contractors, or state employees of the Grand River Dam Authority. The FY'26 Impact is the impact from the effective date of the proposal to June 30, 2026.
