## Bill Summary and Fiscal Analysis:

SB789 permits pharmacies to use drug purchase records without limitation of date or source to validate the dispensing of a prescription drug or a controlled dangerous substance, provided the drug purchase was done in accordance with the law, defines "effective rate contracting," and provides that no pharmacy benefits manager (PBM) can lease, rent, or otherwise make its provider network available to another PBM. The proposal requires PBMs to ensure reimbursement to pharmacies for each drug dispensed is no less than 106% of the National Average Drug Acquisition Cost (NADAC) plus a professional fee of \$15.00.

A fiscal analysis from the Oklahoma Health Care Authority estimates a fiscal impact of \$26,224,233 with regard to the \$15.00 professional fee and NADAC rates.
