AMENDATORY 23 last amended by Section 1 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 758 of the 1st 24

Session of the 60th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as
 follows:

Section 1-109. A. For Except as provided for in subsection N 3 4 of this section, for all public schools in this state, school shall 5 actually be in session and classroom instruction offered: 1. For not less than one hundred eighty (180) days; 6 7 2. For not less than one thousand eighty (1,080) hours each school year, if a district board of education adopts a school-hours 8 9 policy and notifies the State Board of Education prior to October 15 10 of the applicable school year; 11 3. Beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, for not less than one thousand eighty (1,080) hours with a minimum of one hundred 12 13 sixty-five (165) days of instruction each school year, if a district 14 board of education adopts a school-hours policy and notifies the

15 State Board of Education prior to October 15 of the applicable 16 school year; or

4. Beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, for not less than one thousand eighty (1,080) hours each school year, if a district board of education adopts a school-hours policy, notifies the State Board of Education prior to October 15 of the applicable school year, and meets the requirements established by the State Board of Education pursuant to subsection H of this section.

B. A school district may not count more than thirty (30) hours
each school year that are used for attendance of professional

1 meetings toward the one hundred eighty (180) days or one thousand 2 eighty (1,080) hours of classroom instruction time required in 3 subsection A of this section.

С. Teachers off contract with an employing district shall not 4 5 be required by the employing school district to attend professional meetings unless the teacher is paid additional compensation for the 6 7 additional time. Teachers may be paid additional compensation for attending professional meetings in excess of their contract term. 8 9 Subject to district board of education policy or collective 10 bargaining agreement, additional paid professional days may be 11 granted for individual teachers to attend or participate in 12 professional meetings, staff development training, or National Board 13 certification portfolio development as provided for in Section 6-14 204.2 of this title.

D. A school district may authorize parent-teacher conferences to be held during a regular school day. If authorized by the school district, parent-teacher conferences shall be counted as classroom instruction time for no more than six (6) hours per semester, for a total of twelve (12) hours per school year.

E. A school district may maintain school for less than a full school year only when conditions beyond the control of school authorities make the maintenance of the term impossible and the State Board of Education has been apprised and has expressed concurrence in writing.

F. The State Board of Education shall establish criteria for an
 extended-day schedule for schools subject to paragraph 1 of
 subsection A of this section. The criteria shall:

Prescribe a lengthened school day within limits determined
 not to be detrimental to quality instruction;

2. Ensure that the schedule is equivalent in annual hours of
instruction to the one-hundred-eighty-day school year specified in
paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section; and

9 3. Be consistent with the provisions of this section and
10 Sections 1-111 and 1-112 of this title, but may result in fewer
11 annual days of instruction.

G. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection F of this section, a school district board of education subject to paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section may adopt and implement an extendedday schedule subject to the following requirements:

16 1. The annual number of hours of instruction shall equal or 17 exceed one thousand eighty (1,080) hours, which is the equivalent of 18 one hundred eighty (180) days of instruction as specified in 19 subsection A of this section for six (6) hours each day as specified 20 in Section 1-111 of this title;

21 2. The annual number of days of instruction shall equal or 22 exceed one hundred eighty (180) days as specified in subsection A of 23 this section;

3. The schedule adopted shall be consistent with the provisions of Sections 1-111 and 1-112 of this title, except that for not more than one (1) day per week, a school day shall consist of not less than five (5) hours devoted to academic instruction in a regular classroom setting;

4. The district shall hold a public hearing prior to the
adoption of an extended-day schedule authorized pursuant to this
subsection; and

9 5. The district shall document the impact on student achievement as determined by the academic performance data score and 10 11 any other relevant factors that are a result of implementation of an extended-day schedule authorized pursuant to this subsection and 12 13 provide an annual report to the State Board of Education of the 14 results. If improvement in student achievement cannot be documented 15 in the report, the district board of education shall revoke 16 authorization as provided by this subsection. If the district board 17 of education does not revoke authorization after student achievement 18 is not documented in the report, the State Board of Education may 19 deny accreditation of any school in violation of this subsection.

H. Beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, a school district board of education may adopt a school-hours policy as provided for by paragraph 4 of subsection A of this section only if it meets or exceeds the minimum guidelines for student performance and school district cost savings established by the State Board of Education.

The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules, subject to
 approval by the Legislature, establishing the minimum guidelines for
 student performance and school district cost savings.

I. If subject to paragraph 2 of subsection A of this section, a district board of education or designee may elect to close a school during the school day for inclement weather purposes. In such an event, the number of hours incurred in classroom instruction time prior to school closure shall be counted toward the one thousand eighty (1,080) hours per year requirement.

10 Except as provided for in paragraph 2 of this J. 1. 11 subsection, beginning with the 2026-2027 school year a school district or charter school shall not count days or portions of days 12 13 when school is closed and virtual instruction is provided toward the 14 one hundred eighty (180) days or one thousand eighty (1,080) hours 15 of classroom instruction time required by subsection A of this 16 section. For the purposes of this subsection, "virtual instruction" 17 means the use of the Internet or other digital information 18 transmission systems as a form of instruction.

If a plan is disapproved, the 19 school district board of education or charter school 20 governing board may approve a revised plan, publish it 21 on the website for the school district or charter 22 school, and submit it to the Superintendent. The plan 23 shall include a virtual needs assessment which shall 24 address availability of technology infrastructure to

The Board shall accept teaching experience from out-of-country 8 9 schools that are accredited or otherwise endorsed by the appropriate 10 national or regional accrediting or endorsement authority. Out-of-11 country certification documentation in a language other than English 12 shall be analyzed by an educational credential evaluation service in 13 accordance with industry standards and guidelines and approved by 14 the State Department of Education. The person seeking to have 15 credit granted for out-of-country teaching experience shall be 16 responsible for all costs of the analysis by a credential evaluation 17 service. The Board shall accept teaching experience from primary 18 and secondary schools that are operated by the United States Department of Defense or are affiliated with the United States 19 20 Department of State.

D. For the purpose of state salary increments and retirement, no teacher shall be granted credit for more than five (5) years of active duty in the military service or out-of-state or out-ofcountry teaching experience as a certified teacher or its

equivalent. Nothing in this section shall prohibit boards of
 education from crediting more years of experience on district salary
 schedules than those allowed for state purposes.

E. The State Board of Education shall recognize, for purposes

8 the Department of Corrections, beginning with fiscal year 1981;

9 2. Vocational rehabilitation counselor under the Department of 10 Human Services if the counselor was employed as a certified teacher 11 by the State Department of Education when the Division of Vocational 12 Rehabilitation was transferred from the State Board of Career and 13 Technology Education or the State Board of Education to the Oklahoma 14 Public Welfare Commission on July 1, 1968;

15 3. Vocational rehabilitation counselor which were completed 16 while employed by the Department of Human Services if such counselor 17 was certified as a teacher or was eligible for certification as a 18 teacher in Oklahoma this state;

Certified teacher which were completed while employed by the
 Child Study Center located at University Hospital, if the teacher
 was certified as a teacher in Oklahoma this state; and

5. Certified school psychologist or psychometrist which were completed while employed as a doctoral intern, psychological assistant, or psychologist with any agency of the State of Oklahoma

1 <u>this state</u> if the experience primarily involved work with persons of 2 school- or preschool-age and if the person was, at the time the 3 experience was acquired, certified as, or eligible for certification 4 as, a school psychologist or psychometrist.

5 F. The provisions of this section shall not apply to teachers 6 who have entered into postretirement employment with a public school 7 in <del>Oklahoma</del> <u>this state</u> and are still receiving a monthly retirement 8 benefit.

9 G. If a person employed as certified personnel, as defined in Section 26-103 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, by a school 10 district during the 2022-2023 school year was receiving a salary 11 12 above the step level indicated by the State Minimum Salary Schedule 13 for the 2022-2023 school year, the person shall receive a salary 14 increase amount equal to the amount indicated in subsection A for 15 the step level indicated for the person, provided they remain 16 employed by the same district, unless the hours or the duties of the 17 certified personnel are reduced proportionately. 18 H. 4 When determining the Minimum Salary Schedule, "fringe Β. 1. 5 benefits" shall mean all or part of retirement benefits, excluding the contributions made pursuant to subsection A of Section 17-108.1 6 7 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title and the flexible benefit allowance pursuant to Section 26-105 of Title 70 of the 8 9 Oklahoma Statutes this title from the flexible benefit allowance 10 funds disbursed by the State Board of Education and the State Board 11 of Career and Technology Education pursuant to Section 26-104 of 12 Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title.

13 2. If a school district intends to provide retirement benefits 14 to a teacher such that the teacher's salary would be less than the 15 amounts set forth in the minimum salary schedule specified in 16 subsection A of this section, the district shall be required to 17 provide written notification to the teacher prior to his or her 18 employment or, if already employed by the district, no later than 19 thirty (30) days prior to the date the district elects to provide 20 retirement benefits such that the teacher's salary would be less 21 than the minimum salary schedule.

C. Any of the degrees referred to in this section shall be from a college recognized by the State Board of Education. The Board shall accept teaching experience from out-of-state school districts

1 that are accredited by the State Board of Education or appropriate 2 state accrediting agency for the districts. The Board shall accept teaching experience from out-of-country schools that are accredited 3 4 or otherwise endorsed by the appropriate national or regional 5 accrediting or endorsement authority. Out-of-country certification documentation in a language other than English shall be analyzed by 6 an educational credential evaluation service in accordance with 7 industry standards and guidelines and approved by the State 8 9 Department of Education. The person seeking to have credit granted 10 for out-of-country teaching experience shall be responsible for all 11 costs of the analysis by a credential evaluation service. The Board 12 shall accept teaching experience from primary and secondary schools that are operated by the United States Department of Defense or are 13 14 affiliated with the United States Department of State.

D. For the purpose of state salary increments and retirement, no teacher shall be granted credit for more than five (5) years of active duty in the military service or out-of-state or out-ofcountry teaching experience as a certified teacher or its equivalent. Nothing in this section shall prohibit boards of education from crediting more years of experience on district salary schedules than those allowed for state purposes.

E. The State Board of Education shall recognize, for purposes of certification and salary increments, all the years of experience of a:

Certified teacher who teaches in the educational program of
 the Department of Corrections, beginning with fiscal year 1981;

2. Vocational rehabilitation counselor under the Department of
Human Services if the counselor was employed as a certified teacher
by the State Department of Education when the Division of Vocational
Rehabilitation was transferred from the State Board of Career and
Technology Education or the State Board of Education to the Oklahoma
Public Welfare Commission on July 1, 1968;

9 3. Vocational rehabilitation counselor which were completed 10 while employed by the Department of Human Services if such counselor 11 was certified as a teacher or was eligible for certification as a 12 teacher in Oklahoma;

4. Certified teacher which were completed while employed by the
 Child Study Center located at University Hospital, if the teacher
 was certified as a teacher in Oklahoma; and

16 5. Certified school psychologist or psychometrist which were 17 completed while employed as a doctoral intern, psychological 18 assistant, or psychologist with any agency of the State of Oklahoma 19 if the experience primarily involved work with persons of school- or 20 preschool-age and if the person was, at the time the experience was 21 acquired, certified as, or eligible for certification as, a school 22 psychologist or psychometrist.

F. The provisions of this section shall not apply to teachers
 who have entered into postretirement employment with a public school
 in Oklahoma and are still receiving a monthly retirement benefit.

4 G. If a person employed as certified personnel, as defined in Section 26-103 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, by a school 5 district during the 2022-2023 school year was receiving a salary 6 7 above the step level indicated by the State Minimum Salary Schedule for the 2022-2023 school year, the person shall receive a salary 8 9 increase amount equal to the amount indicated in subsection A for 10 the step level indicated for the person, provided they remain 11 employed by the same district, unless the hours or the duties of the 12 certified personnel are reduced proportionately.

H. If a school district does not receive Foundation or Salary Incentive Aid pursuant to Section 18-200.1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, funds shall be allocated by the State Board of Education to implement the salary increases indicated in subsection A of this section.

18 I. Persons employed as classroom instructional employees of 19 technology center school districts supervised by the State Board of 20 Career and Technology Education shall receive a salary increase 21 amount equal to the amount indicated in subsection A of this section 22 for the step level indicated for the person, provided they remain 23 employed by the same technology center school district, unless the

hours or the duties of the classroom instructional employees are
 reduced proportionately.

J. H. Persons employed as correctional teachers or vocational 3 4 instructors by the Department of Corrections pursuant to Section 5 510.6a of Title 57 of the Oklahoma Statutes or persons employed as teachers by the Office of Juvenile Affairs shall receive a salary 6 7 increase amount equal to the amount indicated in subsection A of this section for the step level indicated for the person, provided 8 9 they remain employed by the same Department of Corrections or Office of Juvenile Affairs facility, unless the hours or the duties of the 10 correctional teachers, vocational instructors, or teachers are 11 12 reduced proportionately.

13 K. <u>I.</u> Persons employed as teachers by the State Department of 14 Rehabilitation Services shall receive a salary increase amount equal 15 to the amount indicated in subsection A of this section for the step 16 level indicated for the person, provided they remain employed by the 17 State Department of Rehabilitation Services, unless the hours or the 18 duties of the teachers are reduced proportionately.

19 SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.

20 SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 21 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 22 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 23 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
