An Act relating to the practice of dentistry; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Sections 328.3, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2025, 328.17, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2025, 328.19, as last amended by Section 4, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2025, and 328.21, as last amended by Section 5, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2025 (59 O.S. Supp. 2025, Sections 328.3, 328.17, 328.19, and 328.21), which relate to the State Dental Act; modifying definitions; modifying membership of certain committee; limiting scope of practice of auxiliary health care providers; modifying allowed colleges, programs, and examinations for dentists and dental hygienists; modifying application requirements for dental hygienist advanced procedure permits; providing for licensure of certain foreign applicants; stating qualifications; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Sections 328.22, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 220, O.S.L. 2023, 328.23, 328.23a, as last amended by Section 4, Chapter 46, O.S.L. 2024, 328.24, as last amended by Section 6, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2025, 328.29a, as last amended by Section 11, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2025, 328.31, 328.31b, as last amended by Section 13, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2025, 328.34, as amended by Section 6, Chapter 220, O.S.L. 2023, and 328.54 (59 O.S. Supp. 2025, Sections 328.22, 328.23a, 328.24, 328.29a, 328.31b, and 328.34), which relate to the State Dental Act; adding and modifying certain examination requirements;

1 adding and modifying certain supervision
2 requirements; removing certain registry publication
3 requirement; modifying and removing certain patient
4 record requirements; authorizing patient of record to
be established by teledentistry under certain
conditions; updating statutory references; providing
for codification; and providing an effective date.

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7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

8 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 328.3, as
9 last amended by Section 2, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2025 (59 O.S. Supp.
10 2025, Section 328.3), is amended to read as follows:

11 Section 328.3. As used in the State Dental Act, the following
12 words, phrases, or terms, unless the context otherwise indicates,
13 shall have the following meanings:

14 1. "Accredited dental college" means an institution whose
15 dental educational program is accredited by the Commission on Dental
16 Accreditation of the American Dental Association, the Commission on
17 Dental Accreditation of Canada, or another accrediting association
18 recognized by the United States Department of Education;

19 2. "Accredited dental hygiene program" means a dental hygiene
20 educational program which is accredited by the Commission on Dental
21 Accreditation of the American Dental Association, the Commission on
22 Dental Accreditation of Canada, or another accrediting association
23 recognized by the United States Department of Education;
24

1 3. "Accredited dental assisting program or class" means a
2 dental assisting program or class which is accredited by the
3 Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental
4 Association, the Commission on Dental Accreditation of Canada, or
5 another accrediting association recognized by the United States
6 Department of Education, or a class approved by the Board of
7 Dentistry;

8 4. "Advanced procedure" means a dental procedure for which a
9 dental hygienist has received special training in a course of study
10 approved by the Board;

11 5. "Board" means the Board of Dentistry;

12 6. "Certified dental assistant" means a dental assistant who
13 has earned and maintains current certified dental assistant
14 certification from the Dental Assisting National Board (DANB);

15 7. "Coronal polishing" means a procedure limited to the removal
16 of plaque and stain from exposed tooth surfaces, utilizing a slow
17 speed hand piece with a prophylaxis/polishing cup or brush and polishing
18 agent and is not prophylaxis. To be considered prophylaxis,
19 examination for calculus and scaling must be done by a dental
20 hygienist or dentist;

21 8. "Deep sedation" means a drug-induced depression of
22 consciousness during which patients cannot be easily aroused but
23 respond purposefully following repeated or painful stimulation. The
24 ability to independently maintain ventilator function may be

1 impaired. Patients may require assistance in maintaining a patent
2 airway, and spontaneous ventilation may be inadequate.

3 Cardiovascular function is usually maintained;

4 9. "Dentistry" means the practice of dentistry in all of its
5 branches;

6 10. "Dentist" means a graduate of an accredited dental college
7 who has been issued a license by the Board to practice dentistry as
8 defined in Section 328.19 of this title;

9 11. "Dental ambulatory surgical center (DASC)" means a facility
10 that operates exclusively for the purpose of furnishing outpatient
11 surgical services to patients. A DASC shall have the same
12 privileges and requirements as a dental office and additionally must
13 be an accredited facility by the appropriate entity;

14 12. "Dental appliance" means a dental appliance, prosthetic
15 denture, bridge, restoration, or other device made for an individual
16 patient for a purpose listed in Section 328.19 of this title;

17 13. "Dental office" means an establishment owned and operated
18 by a dentist for the practice of dentistry, which may be composed of
19 reception rooms, business offices, private offices, laboratories,
20 and dental operating rooms where dental operations are performed;

21 14. "Dental hygiene" means the science and practice of the
22 promotion of oral health and prevention and treatment of oral
23 disease through the provision of educational, therapeutic, clinical,
24 and preventive services;

1 15. "Dental hygienist" means an individual who has fulfilled
2 the educational requirements and is a graduate of an accredited
3 dental hygiene program and who has passed an examination and has
4 been issued a license by the Board and who is authorized to practice
5 dental hygiene as defined in this section;

6 16. "Dental assistant" means an individual working for a
7 dentist, under the dentist's general, direct supervision or direct
8 visual supervision, and performing duties in the dental office or a
9 treatment facility including the limited treatment of patients in
10 accordance with the provisions of the State Dental Act. ~~A dental~~
11 ~~assistant may assist a dentist with the patient; provided, this~~
12 ~~shall be done only under the direct supervision or direct visual~~
13 ~~supervision and control of the dentist and only in accordance with~~
14 ~~the educational requirements and rules promulgated by the Board;~~

15 17. "Dental laboratory" means a location, whether in a dental
16 office or not, where a dentist or a dental laboratory technician
17 performs dental laboratory technology;

18 18. "Dental laboratory technician" means an individual whose
19 name is duly filed in the official records of the Board, which
20 authorizes the technician, upon the laboratory prescription of a
21 dentist, to perform dental laboratory technology, which services
22 must be rendered only to the prescribing dentist and not to the
23 public;

1 19. "Dental laboratory technology" means using materials and
2 mechanical devices for the construction, reproduction or repair of
3 dental restorations, appliances or other devices to be worn in a
4 human mouth;

5 20. "Dental specialty" means a specialized practice of a branch
6 of dentistry, recognized by the Board, where the dental college and
7 specialty program are accredited by the Commission on Dental
8 Accreditation (CODA), or a dental specialty recognized by the Board,
9 requiring a minimum number of hours of approved education and
10 training and/or recognition by a nationally recognized association
11 or accreditation board;

12 21. "Direct supervision" means the supervisory dentist is in
13 the dental office or treatment facility and, during the appointment,
14 personally examines the patient, diagnoses any conditions to be
15 treated, and authorizes the procedures to be performed by a dental
16 hygienist or dental assistant. The supervising dentist is
17 continuously on-site and physically present in the dental office or
18 treatment facility while the procedures are being performed and,
19 before dismissal of the patient, evaluates the results of the dental
20 treatment;

21 22. "Direct visual supervision" means the supervisory dentist
22 has direct ongoing visual oversight which shall be maintained at all
23 times during any procedure authorized to be performed by a dental
24 assistant;

1 23. "Expanded duty" means a dental procedure for which a dental
2 assistant has received special training in a course of study
3 approved by the Board;

4 24. "Fellowship" means a program designed for post-residency
5 graduates to gain knowledge and experience in a specialized field;

6 25. "General anesthesia" means a drug-induced loss of
7 consciousness during which patients are not arousable, even by
8 painful stimulation. The ability to independently maintain
9 ventilator function is often impaired. Patients often require
10 assistance in maintaining a patent airway, and positive pressure
11 ventilation may be required because of depressed spontaneous
12 ventilation or drug-induced depression of neuromuscular function.
13 Cardiovascular function may be impaired;

14 26. "General supervision" means the supervisory dentist has
15 diagnosed any conditions to be treated within the past thirteen (13)
16 months, has personally authorized the procedures to be performed by
17 a dental hygienist, and will evaluate the results of the dental
18 treatment within a reasonable time as determined by the nature of
19 the procedures performed, the needs of the patient, and the
20 professional judgment of the supervisory dentist. General
21 supervision may only be used to supervise a dental hygienist and may
22 not be used to supervise a dental assistant except as provided by
23 Section 328.24 or 328.58 of this title;

1 27. "Indirect supervision" means the supervisory dentist is in
2 the dental office or treatment facility and has personally diagnosed
3 any conditions to be treated, authorizes the procedures to be
4 performed by a dental hygienist, remains in the dental office or
5 treatment facility while the procedures are being performed, and
6 will evaluate the results of the dental treatment within a
7 reasonable time as determined by the nature of the procedures
8 performed, the needs of the patient, and the professional judgment
9 of the supervisory dentist. Indirect supervision may not be used
10 for a dental assistant;

11 28. "Investigations" means an investigation proceeding,
12 authorized under Sections 328.15A and 328.43a of this title, to
13 investigate alleged violations of the State Dental Act or the rules
14 of the Board;

15 29. "Laboratory prescription" means a written description,
16 dated and signed by a dentist, of dental laboratory technology to be
17 performed by a dental laboratory technician;

18 30. "Minimal sedation" means a minimally depressed level of
19 consciousness, produced by a pharmacological method, that retains
20 the patient's ability to independently and continuously maintain an
21 airway and respond normally to tactile stimulation and verbal
22 command. Although cognitive function and coordination may be
23 modestly impaired, ventilator and cardiovascular functions are
24 unaffected;

1 31. "Mobile dental anesthesia provider" means a licensed and
2 anesthesia-permitted dentist, physician or Certified Registered
3 Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA) that has a mobile dental unit and provides
4 anesthesia in dental offices and facilities in the state;

5 32. "Mobile dental clinic" means a permitted motor vehicle or
6 trailer utilized as a dental clinic, and/or that contains dental
7 equipment and is used to provide dental services to patients on-site
8 and shall not include a mobile dental anesthesia provider. A mobile
9 dental clinic shall also mean and include a volunteer mobile dental
10 facility that is directly affiliated with a church or religious
11 organization as defined by Section 501(c)(3) or 501(d) of the United
12 States Internal Revenue Code, the church or religious organization
13 with which it is affiliated is clearly indicated on the exterior of
14 the volunteer mobile dental facility, and such facility does not
15 receive any form of payment either directly or indirectly for work
16 provided to patients other than donations through the affiliated
17 church or religious organization; provided, that the volunteer
18 mobile dental facility shall be exempt from any registration fee
19 required under the State Dental Act;

20 33. "Moderate sedation" means a drug-induced depression of
21 consciousness during which patients respond purposefully to verbal
22 commands, either alone or accompanied by light tactile stimulation.
23 No interventions are required to maintain a patent airway, and
24

1 spontaneous ventilation is adequate. Cardiovascular function is
2 usually maintained;

3 34. "Prophylaxis" means the removal of any and all calcareous
4 deposits, stains, accretions or concretions from the supragingival
5 and subgingival surfaces of human teeth, utilizing instrumentation
6 by scaler or periodontal curette on the crown and root surfaces of
7 human teeth including rotary or power-driven instruments. This
8 procedure may only be performed by a dentist or dental hygienist;

9 35. "Patient" or "patient of record" means an individual who
10 has given a medical history and has been examined and accepted by a
11 dentist for dental care;

12 36. "Residencies" are programs designed for advanced clinical
13 and didactic training in general dentistry or other specialties or
14 other specialists at the post-doctoral level recognized by the
15 Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA) or the Board;

16 37. "Supervision" means direct supervision, direct visual
17 supervision, indirect supervision or general supervision;

18 38. "Teledentistry" means the remote delivery of dental patient
19 care via telecommunications and other technology for the exchange of
20 clinical information and images for dental consultation, preliminary
21 treatment planning and patient monitoring; and

22 39. "Treatment facility" means:

23 a. a federal, tribal, state or local public health
24 facility,

- b. a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC),
- c. a private health facility,
- d. a group home or residential care facility serving the elderly, disabled or juveniles,
- e. a hospital or dental ambulatory surgery center (DASC),
- f. a nursing home,
- g. a penal institution operated by or under contract with the federal or state government,
- h. a public or private school,
- i. a patient of record's private residence,
- j. a mobile dental clinic,
- k. a church with a nonprofit clinic,
- l. a dental college, dental program, dental hygiene program or dental assisting program accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation, or
- ~~l.~~ m. such other places as are authorized by the Board.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 328.17, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2025 (59 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 328.17), is amended to read as follows:

Section 328.17. A. 1. The Board of Dentistry shall have the following standing committees that shall meet once per year and other times as needed to study issues affecting the practice of dentistry and the safety of the public and to make recommendations to the Board:

- a. Dental Practice Committee,
- b. Anesthesia Committee,
- c. Specialty Practice Committee,
- d. Historical and Retirement Committee, and
- e. Assistants, Dental Labs and Other Auxiliary Personnel Committee.

2. Each committee shall be cochaired by a current or past Board member to be appointed by the Board President with approval by the Board and a member of a statewide organization representing dentists as recommended by such organization.

3. Each committee may have up to ten committee members, with the exception of the Anesthesia Committee and the Dental Practice Committee, each of which may have up to eighteen members, exclusive of the cochaairs.

4. The Board President, with approval of the Board, shall appoint all committee members. One-half (1/2 or 50%) of the committee members shall be recommended by the Board and one-half (1/2 or 50%) of the committee members shall be recommended to the Board President by a statewide organization representing dentists.

5. Committee members shall be on staggered three-year terms and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board.

B. There shall be a Dental Hygiene Advisory Committee to be composed of the following members:

1. One current dental hygiene member of the Board;

1 2. Two dental hygienists recommended by the Board and two
2 dental hygienists recommended by a statewide organization
3 representing dental hygienists;

4 3. The Committee shall have the following functions:

5 a. to develop and propose recommendations to the Board
6 regarding the education, examination, licensure, and
7 regulation of dental hygienists,

8 b. to advise the Board in rulemaking regarding dental
9 hygiene,

10 c. to hold meetings at least annually, but not more than
11 six (6) times a year, and

12 d. to work directly with the Allied Dental Education
13 Committee in reviews and recommendations for
14 equivalent dental hygiene programs; and

15 4. Members of the Committee shall be appointed by the Board and
16 shall serve a term of three (3) years. Appointments shall be made
17 so that approximately one-third (1/3 or 33%) of the Committee is
18 reappointed at any given time. Members may be appointed for
19 consecutive terms if recommended by the Board President and approved
20 by the Board.

21 C. There shall be an Allied Dental Education Committee.

22 1. The Board President shall appoint all members of the Allied
23 Dental Education Committee upon approval by the Board;

24 2. The Allied Dental Education Committee shall:

- a. review the standards and equivalency of in-state and out-of-state dental and auxiliary program requirements and make recommendations to the Board,
- b. evaluate individual credentials and programs for the purpose of issuing dental assistant expanded duty permits and dental hygiene advanced procedure permits from persons holding out-of-state licenses and permits based on CODA or DANB programs and criteria as defined by the State Dental Act and other statutes and shall make recommendations to the Board,
- c. recommend standards and guidelines and review criteria for all expanded duty programs or courses for dental assistants from CODA approved programs and non-CODA approved providers and advanced procedures of dental hygienists from CODA approved programs or training and non-CODA approved programs or training to the Board, and
- d. recommend and develop guidelines for classroom, electronic media and other forms of education and testing;

3. The Committee shall meet as deemed necessary by the Board President; and

1 4. The Committee may have up to ten (10) members of whom three
2 shall have a background in dental education. The Committee shall be
3 composed of:

- 4 a. the Board President or his or her designee who must be
5 a current or past Board Member,
- 6 b. the hygiene member of the Board or their designee who
7 must be a current or past Board Member,
- 8 c. the Dean of the University of Oklahoma College of
9 Dentistry or his or her designee, and
- 10 d. up to seven at-large members, one of which must be an
11 educator and one of which must have a current
12 Certified Dental Assistant Permit.

13 D. The Board President shall have the authority to appoint
14 other ad hoc committees as needed.

15 E. All Committee members of standing committees, the Hygiene
16 Committee and the Allied Dental Education Committee shall serve
17 staggered three-year terms and serve at the pleasure of the Board.

18 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 328.19, as
19 last amended by Section 4, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2025 (59 O.S. Supp.
20 2025, Section 328.19), is amended to read as follows:

21 Section 328.19. A. The following acts by any person shall be
22 regarded as practicing dentistry within the meaning of the State
23 Dental Act:

- 1 1. Representing oneself to the public as being a dentist or as
2 one authorized to practice dentistry;
- 3 2. Representing oneself to the public as being able to diagnose
4 or examine clinical material or contract for the treating thereof;
- 5 3. Representing oneself as treating or professing to treat by
6 professional instructions or by advertised use of professional
7 equipment or products;
- 8 4. Representing oneself to the public as treating any of the
9 diseases or disorders or lesions of the oral cavity, teeth, gums,
10 maxillary bones, and associate structures;
- 11 5. Removing human teeth;
- 12 6. Repairing or filling cavities in human teeth;
- 13 7. Correcting or attempting to correct malposed teeth;
- 14 8. Administering anesthetics, general or local;
- 15 9. Treating deformities of the jaws and adjacent structures;
- 16 10. Using x-ray and interpreting dental x-ray film;
- 17 11. Offering, undertaking or assisting, by any means or
18 methods, to remove stains, discolorations, or concretions from the
19 teeth; provided, that this paragraph shall not preclude or prohibit
20 the sale of any teeth whitening kit designed for self-administration
21 as approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration;
- 22 12. Operating or prescribing for any disease, pain, injury,
23 deficiency, deformity, or any physical condition connected with the
24 human mouth;

1 13. Taking impressions of the teeth and jaws;

2 14. Furnishing, supplying, constructing, reproducing, or
3 repairing, or offering to furnish, supply, construct, reproduce, or
4 repair, prosthetic dentures, sometimes known as plates, bridges, or
5 other substitutes for natural teeth for the user or prospective user
6 thereof;

7 15. Adjusting or attempting to adjust any prosthetic denture,
8 bridge, appliance, or any other structure to be worn in the human
9 mouth;

10 16. Diagnosing, making, and adjusting appliances to artificial
11 casts of malposed teeth for treatment of the malposed teeth in the
12 human mouth, without instructions;

13 17. Writing a laboratory prescription to a dental laboratory or
14 dental laboratory technician for the construction, reproduction or
15 repair of any appliance or structure to be worn in the human mouth;

16 18. Owning, maintaining, or operating an office or offices by
17 holding a financial interest in same for the practice of dentistry;
18 or

19 19. Any other procedure otherwise defined in the State Dental
20 Act requiring a valid license or permit to perform while the person
21 does not hold such valid license or permit issued by the Board.

22 B. The fact that a person uses any dental degree, or
23 designation, or any card, device, directory, poster, sign or other
24 media representing oneself to be a dentist shall be prima facie

1 evidence that the person is engaged in the practice of dentistry;
2 provided that nothing in this section shall be so construed as to
3 prevent the following:

4 1. Physicians or surgeons, who are licensed under the laws of
5 this state, from administering any kind of treatment coming within
6 the province of medicine or surgery;

7 2. The practice of dentistry in the discharge of the person's
8 official duties by dentists in the United States Army, the United
9 States Navy, the United States Air Force, the United States Marine
10 Corps, the United States Coast Guard, the United States Public
11 Health Service, or the United States Veterans Administration;

12 3. Dental schools or colleges, as now conducted and approved,
13 or as may be approved, and the practice of dentistry by students in
14 dental schools, colleges or hospitals, approved by the Board, when
15 acting under the direction and supervision of licensed dentists or
16 dentists holding properly issued permits acting as instructors;

17 4. Acts of a dental clinician or other participant at a dental
18 educational meeting or at an accredited dental college, when no fee
19 is charged to or paid by a patient;

20 5. The practice of dental hygiene, as defined herein, by a
21 person granted a license by the Board;

22 6. The performing of acts by a dental assistant who performs
23 the acts under the general, direct supervision or direct visual
24

1 supervision of a dentist and in accordance with the provisions of
2 the State Dental Act and the rules promulgated by the Board; or

3 7. The fabrication of dental appliances pursuant to a
4 laboratory prescription of a dentist, by a dental laboratory
5 technician in a dental laboratory using inert materials and
6 mechanical devices for the fabrication of any restoration, appliance
7 or thing to be worn in the human mouth.

8 C. Any auxiliary health care provider licensed or permitted by
9 this state who is working under the supervision of a dentist shall
10 be limited to practicing within the scope of dentistry as provided
11 by the State Dental Act.

12 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 328.21, as
13 last amended by Section 5, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2025 (59 O.S. Supp.
14 2025, Section 328.21), is amended to read as follows:

15 Section 328.21. A. No person shall practice dentistry, dental
16 hygiene, or dental assisting without first applying for and
17 obtaining a license from the Board of Dentistry.

18 B. Application shall be made to the Board in writing and shall
19 be accompanied by the fee established by the rules of the Board,
20 together with satisfactory proof that the applicant:

- 21 1. Is of good moral character;
- 22 2. Is twenty-one (21) years of age, or over, at the time of
23 making application to practice dentistry or eighteen (18) years of
24 age, or over, if the applicant is to practice dental hygiene;

1 3. Has passed a written theoretical examination and a clinical
2 examination approved by the Board within the previous five (5)
3 years; and

4 4. Has passed a written jurisprudence examination over the
5 rules and laws affecting dentistry in this state.

6 C. An application from a candidate who desires to secure a
7 license from the Board to practice dentistry or dental hygiene in
8 this state shall be accompanied by satisfactory proof that the
9 applicant:

10 1. Is a graduate of an accredited dental college in the United
11 States or Canada, if the applicant is to practice dentistry;

12 2. Is a graduate of an accredited dental hygiene program in the
13 United States or Canada, if the applicant is to practice dental
14 hygiene; and

15 3. Has passed all portions of the National Board Dental
16 Examination or the National Board Dental Hygiene Examination.

17 D. Pursuant to Section 328.15 of this title, the Board may
18 affiliate as a member state, and accept regional exams from the
19 ~~Commission on Dental Competency Assessments (CDCA-WREB-CITA)~~
20 American Board of Dental Examiners (ADEX) if the following
21 requirements are included:

22 1. For dental licensing the following components on a live
23 patient or manikin:
24

- a. a fixed prosthetic component of the preparation of an anterior all porcelain crown and the preparation of a three-unit posterior bridge,
- b. a periodontal component,
- c. an endodontic component,
- d. an anterior class III and posterior class II restorative component,
- e. a diagnosis and treatment planning section as approved by the Board, as specified in Section 328.15 of this title, and
- f. the Board may determine equivalencies based on components of other exams for the purpose of credentialing; or

2. For dental hygienists licensing the following components on a live patient or manikin:

- a. clinical patient treatments with an evaluation of specific clinical skills, and
- b. evaluation of the candidate's compliance with professional standards during the treatment as approved by the Board in Section 328.15 of this title and shall include:
 - (1) extra/intra oral assessment,
 - (2) periodontal probing, and

1 (3) scaling/subgingival calculus removal and
2 supragingival deposit removal.

3 E. When the applicant and the accompanying proof are found
4 satisfactory, the Board shall notify the applicant to appear for the
5 jurisprudence examination at the time and place to be fixed by the
6 Board. A dental student or a dental hygiene student in the
7 student's last semester of a dental or dental hygiene program,
8 having met all other requirements, may make application and take the
9 jurisprudence examination with a letter from the dean of the dental
10 school or director of the hygiene program stating that the applicant
11 is a candidate for graduation within the next six (6) months.

12 F. The Board shall require every applicant for a license to
13 practice dentistry or dental hygiene to submit, for the files of the
14 Board, a copy of a dental degree or dental hygiene degree, an
15 official transcript, a recent photograph duly identified and
16 attested, and any other information as required by the Board.

17 G. Any applicant who fails to pass the jurisprudence
18 examination may apply for a second examination, in which case the
19 applicant shall pay a reexamination fee as established by the
20 statutes or rules of the State Dental Act.

21 H. A dentist or dental hygienist currently licensed in another
22 state having met the qualifications in paragraphs 1 through 3 of
23 subsections B and C of this section may apply for a license by
24 credentials upon meeting the following:

1 1. A dentist holding a general dentist license in good standing
2 and having practiced for at least five hundred (500) hours within
3 the previous five (5) years immediately prior to application and
4 having passed a regional examination substantially equivalent to the
5 requirements for this state may apply for licensure by credentials;

6 2. A dental hygienist holding a dental hygiene license in good
7 standing and having practiced for at least four hundred twenty (420)
8 hours within the previous five (5) years immediately prior to
9 application and having passed a regional examination substantially
10 equivalent to the requirements for this state may apply for
11 licensure by credentials. Applicants for credentialing must
12 include:

13 a. a letter of good standing from all states in which the
14 applicant has ever been licensed, and

15 b. any other requirements as set forth by the rules;

16 3. An applicant applying for a dental or dental hygiene license
17 by credentials shall only be required to pass the jurisprudence
18 portion of the examination requirements as set forth in paragraph 4
19 of subsection B of this section; and

20 4. The spouse of an active duty military member pursuant to a
21 current permanent change of station order from the military who was
22 actively licensed in another state for the previous two (2) years
23 shall be eligible for a license or permit pursuant to the
24 requirements listed in 50 U.S.C., Section 4025(a).

1 I. 1. There shall be seven types of advanced procedures
2 available for dental hygienists upon completion of ~~a Commission on~~
3 ~~Dental Accreditation (CODA)~~ approved an accredited program, course,
4 or certification program in the United States or Canada that has
5 been approved by the Board:

- 6 a. administration of nitrous oxide,
- 7 b. administration of local anesthesia,
- 8 c. neuromodulator administration,
- 9 d. therapeutic use of lasers,
- 10 e. phlebotomy,
- 11 f. venipuncture, and
- 12 g. elder care and public health pursuant to Section
13 328.58 of this title.

14 2. A dental hygienist holding an advanced procedure permit or
15 credential in any other state for two (2) years shall be eligible
16 for the advanced procedure permit by credentials; provided, that
17 application for the advanced procedure permit by credentials for
18 administration of local anesthesia shall additionally require proof
19 of passage of such advanced procedure in ~~a CDCA-WREB-CITA~~ an
20 American Board of Dental Examiners (ADEX) exam.

21 3. For all advanced procedures other than administration of
22 local anesthesia, a dental hygienist may apply by filling out an
23 application with required documentation of education, training ~~as~~
24 ~~required by state law and rules of the Board~~, or verification of

1 active practice for the previous two (2) years of the advanced
2 procedure in a dental office. A dental hygienist licensed by the
3 Board prior to January 30, 2024, shall be eligible for the advanced
4 procedure of therapeutic use of lasers upon submission of an
5 affidavit attesting to two (2) years of practice using lasers.

6 4. All advanced procedures shall be added to the dental hygiene
7 license upon ~~approval~~ verification of documentation as described in
8 paragraphs 2 and 3 of this subsection.

9 J. All licensees and permit holders shall display the current
10 permit or license in a visible place within the dental office or
11 treatment facility.

12 K. The Board shall have the authority to temporarily change
13 requirements of an examination due to availability or changes in the
14 examination format, not to exceed one (1) year.

15 L. During a year in which governmental officials have declared
16 a health pandemic, a state or federal disaster, or other natural or
17 man-made disaster, the Board shall have the authority through a
18 resolution to change or make allowances in requirements of all
19 candidates for licensure and issue temporary licenses for extended
20 periods of time or as needed until the event passes. The resolution
21 shall have a beginning and an end date and shall automatically
22 expire no less than thirty (30) days after the end of the disaster
23 is declared by governmental officials.

1 M. Every licensee or permit holder shall have an official
2 address and email address listed with the Board. Every licensee or
3 permit holder shall update the address within thirty (30) calendar
4 days of moving. Official notification of any action of the Board
5 adverse to a licensee or permit holder including but not limited to
6 notification of license or permit cancellation due to nonrenewal,
7 notice of a formal complaint, or a decision of the hearing panel or
8 board, shall be served to the licensee or permit holder by
9 registered mail at the official address, in person, to the
10 licensee's or permit holder's attorney, by agreement of the
11 individual, by a process server, or by an investigator of the Board
12 pursuant to Section 2004 of Title 12 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

13 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 328.21a of Title 59, unless
15 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 A dentist, having received a dental degree or certificate in a
17 foreign country from a program that is not accredited in the United
18 States or Canada, may apply for a dental hygiene license upon
19 meeting the following requirements:

20 1. The applicant shall provide proof of a valid dental
21 education and degree, certificate, or other proof accepted by the
22 Board of Dentistry and proof of lawful practice of dentistry for the
23 past two (2) years in a foreign country. All documents shall be
24 translated to English and verifiable by the Board;

1 2. Successful passage of the American Board of Dental Examiners
2 (ADEX) dental hygiene licensure exam;

3 3. Successful passage of the Test of English as a Foreign
4 Language (TOEFL). The applicant shall provide proof of passage of
5 such exam within the past five (5) years;

6 4. Successful completion of an evaluation program to practice
7 dental hygiene conducted by the University of Oklahoma College of
8 Dentistry; and

9 5. Successful completion of the jurisprudence examination.

10 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 328.22, as
11 amended by Section 3, Chapter 220, O.S.L. 2023 (59 O.S. Supp. 2025,
12 Section 328.22), is amended to read as follows:

13 Section 328.22. A. 1. The Board of Dentistry may issue a
14 dental specialty license authorizing a dentist to represent himself
15 or herself to the public as a specialist, and to practice as a
16 specialist, in a dental specialty.

17 2. No dentist shall represent himself or herself to the public
18 as a specialist or practice as a specialist as listed in this
19 paragraph, unless the individual:

20 a. has successfully completed an advanced dental
21 specialty educational program accredited by the
22 Commission on Dental Accreditation, or has met the
23 board certification requirements and is recognized as
24 a current board certified member of a dental specialty

1 organization or association recognized by the National
2 Commission on Recognition of Dental Specialties and
3 Certifying Boards,

4 b. has passed the jurisprudence examination covering the
5 State Dental Act, rules and state laws, ~~and~~

6 c. has passed a regional exam as described in subsection
7 D of Section 328.21 of this title, or is board-
8 certified in his or her specialty as described in
9 subparagraph a of this paragraph, and

10 d. has completed any additional requirements set forth in
11 state law or rules and has been issued a dental
12 specialty license by the Board.

13 3. Specialty licenses recognized by the Board shall include:

- 14 a. dental public health,
15 b. endodontics,
16 c. oral and maxillofacial surgery,
17 d. oral and maxillofacial radiology,
18 e. orthodontics and dentofacial orthopedics,
19 f. pediatric dentistry,
20 g. periodontics,
21 h. prosthodontics,
22 i. oral and maxillofacial pathology,
23 j. dental anesthesiology,
24 k. oral medicine, and

1 1. orofacial pain.

2 B. 1. At the time of application, if the dentist has ever been
3 licensed in any other state, he or she shall provide a letter of
4 good standing from such state before the Board may issue a specialty
5 license.

6 2. In conducting an investigation of an applicant who has
7 applied for a dental specialty license pursuant to this subsection,
8 the Board shall require of the applicant disclosure of the same
9 background information as is required of an applicant for a license
10 to practice dentistry in this state.

11 C. Any person holding an Oklahoma specialty license that does
12 not have an Oklahoma general dentistry license shall be limited to
13 practicing that specialty for which they hold a license.

14 D. The Board may use the American Dental Association National
15 Commission on Recognition of Dental Specialties and Certifying
16 Boards guidelines or the guidelines of another nationally recognized
17 dental association or board for the purpose of defining a specialty
18 practice area not otherwise defined herein.

19 SECTION 7. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 328.23, is
20 amended to read as follows:

21 Section 328.23. A. The President of the Board, upon
22 verification that a person meets the requirements provided for in
23 this section and any other requirements provided for in the State
24 Dental Act, may issue an emergency temporary license to practice

1 dentistry for thirty (30) days. A temporary license may be extended
2 but shall not exceed ninety (90) days or the next available
3 regularly scheduled Board meeting.

4 B. The President of the Board, upon verification that a person
5 meets the requirements provided for in the State Dental Act, may
6 issue an emergency temporary license to practice dental hygiene,
7 which shall expire as of the date of the next dental hygiene
8 clinical examination in Oklahoma, as required by the Board.

9 C. An active duty military spouse residing with the active duty
10 member having met the requirements for licensure shall be eligible
11 for a temporary license.

12 D. Any applicant requesting an emergency temporary license
13 shall submit a letter explaining the exigent circumstances along
14 with all application materials. The determination of whether or not
15 to grant the emergency temporary license based upon the exigent
16 circumstances shall be at the sole discretion of the President or
17 acting President of the Board.

18 E. A holder of a temporary license to practice dentistry or
19 dental hygiene shall have the same rights and privileges and be
20 governed by the State Dental Act and the rules of the Board in the
21 same manner as a holder of a permanent license to practice dentistry
22 and dental hygiene.

23 F. The President of the Board may authorize patient treatment
24 and care by individuals taking the ~~Commission on Dental Competency~~

1 ~~Assessments (CDCA) or the Western Regional Examining Board exam, or~~
2 ~~other regional exams as approved by the Board, American Board of~~
3 ~~Dental Examiners (ADEX) exam in order for such individuals to~~
4 complete criteria related to Board examinations. The Board may
5 authorize specialty examinations to be given throughout the year as
6 needed.

7 SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 328.23a, as
8 last amended by Section 4, Chapter 46, O.S.L. 2024 (59 O.S. Supp.
9 2025, Section 328.23a), is amended to read as follows:

10 Section 328.23a. A. There is established a special volunteer
11 license for dentists and a special volunteer license for dental
12 hygienists who are retired from active practice or out-of-state
13 licensees in active practice who are in the Oklahoma Medical Reserve
14 Corps or assisting with emergency management, emergency operations
15 or hazard mitigation in response to any emergency, man-made disaster
16 or natural disaster, or participating in public health initiatives,
17 disaster drills and community service events that are endorsed by a
18 city or county health department or the State Department of Health
19 and wish to donate their expertise for the dental care and treatment
20 of indigent and needy persons of the state. A special volunteer
21 license may also be issued for any live patient training approved by
22 the Board of Dentistry. The special volunteer license shall be:

- 23 1. Issued by the Board of Dentistry to eligible persons;
24

1 2. Issued without the payment of an application fee, license
2 fee or renewal fee;

3 3. Issued or renewed without any continuing education
4 requirements for a period less than one (1) calendar year; and

5 4. Issued for one (1) calendar year or part thereof.

6 B. A special volunteer license may be issued for a dentist or
7 dental hygienist who is on active duty military service. This
8 license shall not be subject to paragraph 4 of subsection A of this
9 section and may be issued for the time period of the tour of duty.

10 C. A dentist or dental hygienist must meet the following
11 requirements to be eligible for a special volunteer license:

12 1. Completion of a special volunteer dental or dental hygiene
13 license application including documentation of the dental or dental
14 hygiene school graduation and practice history;

15 2. Documentation that the dentist or dental hygienist has been
16 previously issued a full and unrestricted license to practice
17 dentistry or dental hygiene in this state or in another state of the
18 United States and that he or she has never been the subject of any
19 reportable medical or dental disciplinary action in any
20 jurisdiction. If the dentist or dental hygienist is licensed in
21 more than one state and any license of the licensee is suspended,
22 revoked, or subject to any agency order limiting or restricting
23 practice privileges, or has been voluntarily terminated under threat
24

1 of sanction, the dentist or dental hygienist shall be ineligible to
2 receive a special volunteer license;

3 3. Acknowledgement and documentation that the dentist's or
4 dental hygienist's practice under the special volunteer license will
5 be exclusively and totally devoted to providing dental care to needy
6 and indigent persons in this state;

7 4. Acknowledgement and documentation that the dentist or dental
8 hygienist will not receive or have the expectation to receive any
9 payment or compensation, either direct or indirect, for any dental
10 services rendered under the special volunteer license; and

11 5. A listing of all locations and dates that the person will be
12 completing volunteer work under the special volunteer license.

13 D. The Board of Dentistry shall have jurisdiction over
14 dentists, dental hygienists, dental assistants and dental
15 technicians who volunteer their professional services in the state.
16 Dental assistants and dental technicians shall work under the direct
17 supervision of a dentist. A dental assistant may work under general
18 supervision of a dentist to assist a dental hygienist with a
19 procedure that the hygienist is allowed to perform under general
20 supervision as provided by Section 328.34 of this title.

21 E. Dental assistants may be issued a volunteer permit at the
22 request of an entity that provides dental services to the needy.
23 Volunteers in a volunteer initiative who are not dentists or dental
24 hygienists shall be named and provided on a list to the Board by the

1 entity hosting the volunteer initiative with any other requirements
2 as set forth by the Board. The Board shall provide written
3 documentation to the host entity designating all persons who may
4 participate in the volunteer initiative including authorization of
5 the timetable requested by the host entity for granting licensure
6 exemption. Any person working under a volunteer dental assistant
7 permit shall not receive payment or compensation for any services
8 rendered under the volunteer dental assistant permit. Volunteer
9 dental assistant permits shall be limited to specific dates and
10 locations of services to be provided.

11 F. All persons providing care shall do so under the provisions
12 specified in Section 328.1 et seq. of this title or rules
13 promulgated by the Board. Only those functions authorized by law or
14 administrative rule shall be performed by the named person approved
15 by the Board.

16 G. Volunteers shall not use sedation or general anesthesia
17 during volunteer procedures.

18 H. Volunteers shall use a form to be provided by the Board for
19 any patient with clear instructions for any and all follow-up care.

20 I. At any time, the Board shall revoke a volunteer license
21 based on documentation of failure to participate according to state
22 laws or administrative rules.

23 J. A special volunteer license shall be restricted to services
24 provided at the locations listed on the application or for a

1 specific not-for-profit treatment provider group as approved by the
2 Board.

3 K. A special volunteer license may be issued to a dentist with
4 an active license in good standing in another state for the purpose
5 of participating in a continuing education class that includes live
6 patient treatment as a part of the training program.

7 SECTION 9. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 328.24, as
8 last amended by Section 6, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2025 (59 O.S. Supp.
9 2025, Section 328.24), is amended to read as follows:

10 Section 328.24. A. No person shall practice as a dental
11 assistant without first applying for and obtaining a permit from the
12 Board of Dentistry.

13 B. The application shall be made to the Board in writing and
14 shall be accompanied by the fee established by the Board, together
15 with satisfactory proof that the applicant passes a background check
16 with criteria established by the Board.

17 C. Every dental assistant receiving a permit shall complete a
18 class on infection control as approved by the Board within one (1)
19 year from the date of receipt of the permit. Failure to complete
20 the class shall be grounds for discipline pursuant to Section
21 328.29a of this title.

22 D. There shall be eight types of expanded duty permits
23 available for dental assistants upon completion of a program
24

1 approved by the Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA) or a
2 course that has been approved by the Board:

- 3 1. Radiation safety;
- 4 2. Coronal polishing and topical fluoride;
- 5 3. Sealants;
- 6 4. Assisting in the administration of nitrous oxide;
- 7 5. Phlebotomy;
- 8 6. Venipuncture;
- 9 7. Elder care and public health; or
- 10 8. Oral maxillofacial surgery. An oral maxillofacial surgery

11 expanded duty permit shall be available to a dental assistant who
12 has met the requirements as listed in Section 328.25 of this title
13 and assists a dentist, pediatric dentist, or oral maxillofacial
14 surgeon who holds a parenteral or general anesthesia permit;
15 provided, only the dentist, pediatric dentist, or oral maxillofacial
16 surgeon, or an anesthesiologist or a Certified Registered Nurse
17 Anesthetist, may administer anesthesia and assess the patient's
18 level of sedation and only the dentist, pediatric dentist, or oral
19 maxillofacial surgeon may perform surgery.

20 All expanded duties shall be added to the dental assistant
21 permit upon approval by the Board.

22 E. The training requirements for all expanded duty permits
23 shall be set forth by the Board. A program that is not CODA-

1 certified must meet the standards set forth and be approved by the
2 Board.

3 F. An applicant for a dental assistant permit who has graduated
4 from a dental assisting program accredited by CODA and has passed
5 the jurisprudence examination shall receive all expanded duty
6 permits provided for in subsection D of this section if the course
7 materials approved by the Board are covered in the program.

8 G. A dental assistant who holds an out-of-state dental
9 assistant permit with expanded duties may apply for credentialing
10 and reciprocity for a dental assistant permit including any expanded
11 duty by demonstrating the following:

12 1. The dental assistant has had a valid dental assistant permit
13 in another state for a minimum of two (2) years and is in good
14 standing;

15 2. The dental assistant has had a valid expanded duty in
16 another state for a minimum of one (1) year; and

17 3. The dental assistant provides a certificate or proof of
18 completion of an educational class for the expanded duty and that
19 the dental assistant has been providing this treatment to dental
20 patients while working as a dental assistant in a dental office for
21 one (1) year.

22 H. Any person having served in the military as a dental
23 assistant shall receive credentialing and reciprocity for expanded
24 functions by demonstrating the following:

1 1. Proof of military service in excess of two (2) years with
2 any certifications or training in the expanded function areas; and

3 2. Verification from the commanding officer of the medical
4 program or the appropriate supervisor stating that the dental
5 assistant provided the expanded functions on patients in the
6 military dental facility for a minimum of one (1) year within the
7 past five (5) years.

8 I. Dental assistants shall work under the direct supervision of
9 a dentist for all procedures with the following exceptions:

10 1. A dental assistant may complete radiation safety under the
11 general supervision of a dentist; and

12 2. A dental assistant may work under the general supervision of
13 a dentist to assist a dental hygienist with a procedure that the
14 dental hygienist is allowed to perform under general supervision.

15 SECTION 10. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 328.29a, as
16 last amended by Section 11, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2025 (59 O.S. Supp.
17 2025, Section 328.29a), is amended to read as follows:

18 Section 328.29a. A. The following acts or occurrences by a
19 dental assistant shall constitute grounds for which the penalties
20 specified in Section 328.44a of this title may be imposed by the
21 Board of Dentistry or be the basis for denying a new applicant any
22 license or permit issued by the Board:

23 1. Any of the causes now existing in the laws of this state;

24 2. A violation of the provisions of the State Dental Act; or

1 3. A violation of the rules of the Board promulgated pursuant
2 to the State Dental Act.

3 B. The Board shall also have the power to act upon a petition
4 by a dental assistant for reinstatement to good standing. The Board
5 shall keep a record of the evidence and proceedings in all matters
6 involving the revocation or suspension of a permit, censure or
7 probation of a dental assistant. The Board shall make findings of
8 fact and a decision thereon. Notification of the licensee or permit
9 holder shall occur pursuant to Section 328.21 of this title.

10 C. The decision shall be final unless the dental assistant
11 appeals the decision as provided by the State Dental Act.

12 D. The Board shall have power to revoke or suspend the permit,
13 censure, or place on probation a dental assistant for a violation of
14 one or more of the following:

15 1. Pleading guilty or nolo contendere to, or being convicted
16 of, a felony crime that substantially relates to the occupation of a
17 dental assistant and poses a reasonable threat to public safety, or
18 a violation of federal or state controlled dangerous substances
19 laws;

20 2. Presenting to the Board a false application or documentation
21 for a permit;

22 3. Being, by reason of persistent inebriety or addiction to
23 drugs, incompetent to continue to function as a dental assistant;
24

1 4. Functioning outside the general direct or direct visual
2 supervision of a dentist for a procedure as required by the State
3 Dental Act;

4 5. Performing any function prohibited by Chapter 15 of the
5 Oklahoma Administrative Code or any violation that would be a
6 violation for a dentist or hygienist under Section 328.32 or 328.33
7 of this title, or any other duty not assignable to a dental
8 assistant; or

9 6. Failure to secure an annual registration as specified in
10 Section 328.41 of this title.

11 E. The Board's review panel, as set forth in Section 328.43a of
12 this title, upon concurrence with the president of the Board, may
13 determine that an emergency exists to temporarily suspend the permit
14 of a dental assistant if the panel finds that public health, safety
15 or welfare imperatively requires emergency action. The panel may
16 conduct a hearing pursuant to Section 314 of Title 75 of the
17 Oklahoma Statutes for the temporary suspension.

18 F. As used in this section:

19 1. "Substantially relates" means the nature of criminal conduct
20 for which the person was convicted has a direct bearing on the
21 fitness or ability to perform one or more of the duties or
22 responsibilities necessarily related to the occupation; and

23 2. "Poses a reasonable threat" means the nature of criminal
24 conduct for which the person was convicted involved an act or threat

1 of harm against another and has a bearing on the fitness or ability
2 to serve the public or work with others in the occupation.

3 SECTION 11. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 328.31, is
4 amended to read as follows:

5 Section 328.31. A. Professional entities formed pursuant to
6 the Professional Entity Act, for the purpose of rendering
7 professional services by a dentist, shall be subject to all of the
8 provisions of the State Dental Act, except that professional
9 entities shall not be required to obtain a license from the Board of
10 Dentistry. Individuals who hold a license issued by the Board shall
11 be responsible, pursuant to the State Dental Act, for their personal
12 conduct without regard to the fact that they are acting as an owner,
13 manager, agent or employee of, or the holder of an interest in, a
14 professional entity.

15 B. Professional entities formed for the purpose of rendering
16 professional services by a dentist must register with the Board
17 before rendering such services and must update the registration
18 during the renewal period of each year. The Board shall:

19 1. Provide the form and establish the fee for the registration
20 and update; and

21 2. Maintain a registry of all such professional entities; ~~and~~

22 ~~3. Publish annually a summary of the registry.~~
23
24

1 C. The Board is authorized to issue certificates pursuant to
2 Section 804 of Title 18 of the Oklahoma Statutes and shall maintain
3 a record of each certificate issued.

4 D. Enforcement actions by the Board for violation of the State
5 Dental Act or the rules of the Board may be brought against a
6 professional entity as well as against any individual who is or has
7 acted as an owner, manager, agent or employee of, or the holder of
8 an interest in, the professional entity.

9 SECTION 12. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 328.31b, as
10 last amended by Section 13, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2025 (59 O.S. Supp.
11 2025, Section 328.31b), is amended to read as follows:

12 Section 328.31b. A. Every dental office or treatment facility,
13 whether individual, group or multi-doctor practice operating under a
14 name, trade name or other professional entity shall maintain written
15 records on each patient treated at the facility and shall make these
16 records available to the Board of Dentistry and other regulatory
17 entities or be subject to the penalties as set forth in Section
18 328.44a of this title.

19 B. Each licensed dentist shall maintain written records on each
20 patient that shall contain, at a minimum, the following information
21 about the patient:

22 1. A current health history listing known illnesses, other
23 treating physicians and current medications prescribed;
24

1 2. Results of a clinical examination, including a physical
2 intraoral examination and head and neck examination, tests
3 conducted, and any lab results including the identification, or lack
4 thereof, of any oral pathology or diseases;

5 3. Treatment plan proposed by the dentist; and

6 4. Treatment rendered to the patient. The patient record shall
7 clearly identify the dentist and the dental hygienist or dental
8 assistant providing the treatment with the dentist, specialty or
9 dental hygienist license number. The patient record shall include
10 documentation of any medications prescribed, administered or
11 dispensed to the patient.

12 C. Prior to a dentist prescribing, diagnosing, or overseeing
13 patient treatment for any dental appliance, the patient shall be a
14 patient of record and the dentist shall conduct an in-person patient
15 examination.

16 D. 1. The name of the dentist or dentists actually providing
17 the dental services to the patient shall appear on all insurance
18 claim forms, ~~billing invoices, or statements sent to the patient and~~
19 ~~on all receipts if any are given to the patient.~~

20 2. Treatment records shall be maintained for each patient that
21 clearly identify ~~the dentist or~~ all dentists, dental hygienists, and
22 dental assistants who performed ~~all~~ any dental services for the
23 patient.
24

1 E. Whenever patient records are released or transferred, the
2 dentist releasing or transferring the records shall maintain either
3 the original records or copies thereof and a notation shall be made
4 in the retained records indicating to whom the records were released
5 or transferred.

6 F. All claims being submitted for insurance must be signed,
7 stamped or have an electronic signature by the treating dentist.

8 G. Patient records may be kept in an electronic data format,
9 provided that the dentist maintains a backup copy of information
10 stored in the data processing system using disk, tape or other
11 electronic back-up system and that backup is updated on a regular
12 basis, at least weekly, to assure that data is not lost due to
13 system failure. Any electronic data system shall be capable of
14 producing a hard copy on demand.

15 H. All patient records shall be maintained for seven (7) years
16 from the date of treatment.

17 I. Each licensed dentist shall retain a copy of each entry in
18 his or her patient appointment book, calendar, or such other log,
19 calendar, book, file or computer data used in lieu of an appointment
20 book for a period no less than seven (7) years from the date of each
21 entry thereon.

22 J. A licensee closing an office shall notify the Board in
23 writing and include the location of where the patient records will
24 be maintained.

SECTION 13. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 328.34, as amended by Section 6, Chapter 220, O.S.L. 2023 (59 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 328.34), is amended to read as follows:

Section 328.34. A. A dental hygienist may practice dental hygiene under the supervision of a dentist in a dental office or treatment facility. A dentist may employ not more than the equivalent of three full-time dental hygienists for each dentist actively practicing in the same dental office. Employing the equivalent of three dental hygienists shall mean the employment or any combination of full- or part-time dental hygienists not to exceed one hundred twenty (120) hours per week per dentist.

B. 1. A dentist may delegate to a dental hygienist the following procedures:

- a. the duties and expanded duties authorized for dental assistants by the State Dental Act or the rules of the Board of Dentistry,
- b. health history assessment pertaining to dental hygiene,
- c. dental hygiene examination and the charting of intra-oral and extra-oral conditions, which include periodontal charting, dental charting and classifying occlusion,
- d. dental hygiene assessment and treatment planning for procedures authorized by the supervisory dentist,

- 1 e. prophylaxis, which means the removal of any and all
2 calcareous deposits, stains, accretions, or
3 concretions from the supragingival and subgingival
4 surfaces of human teeth, utilizing instrumentation by
5 scaler or periodontal curette on the crown and root
6 surfaces of human teeth, including rotary or power-
7 driven instruments. This paragraph shall not be
8 construed to prohibit the use of a prophylaxis/polishing
9 cup or brush on the crowns of human teeth by a dental
10 assistant who holds a current expanded duty permit for
11 coronal polishing and topical fluoride issued by the
12 Board,
- 13 f. periodontal scaling and root planing,
14 g. dental hygiene nutritional and dietary evaluation,
15 h. placement of subgingival prescription drugs for
16 prevention and treatment of periodontal disease,
17 i. soft tissue curettage,
18 j. placement of temporary fillings,
19 k. removal of overhanging margins,
20 l. dental implant maintenance,
21 m. removal of periodontal packs,
22 n. polishing of amalgam restorations, and
23 o. other procedures authorized by the Board.
24

1 2. The procedures specified in subparagraphs b through o of
2 paragraph 1 of this subsection may be performed only by a dentist or
3 a dental hygienist.

4 3. Except as provided in subsections C and D of this section,
5 the procedures specified in paragraph 1 of this subsection may be
6 performed by a dental hygienist only on a patient of record and only
7 under the supervision of a dentist. The advanced procedures of
8 administration of nitrous oxide, administration of local anesthesia,
9 and therapeutic use of lasers may be performed under general
10 supervision. The advanced procedures of neuromodulator
11 administration, therapeutic use of lasers, and phlebotomy and
12 venipuncture shall be performed only under the direct or indirect
13 supervision of a dentist. The level of supervision, whether direct,
14 indirect, or general, for the advanced procedure of elder care and
15 public health pursuant to Section ~~7 of this act~~ 328.24 or 328.58 of
16 this title shall be at the discretion of the supervisory dentist.
17 Authorization for general supervision shall be limited to a maximum
18 of thirteen (13) months following an examination by the supervisory
19 dentist of a patient of record.

20 C. 1. A dentist may authorize procedures to be performed by a
21 dental hygienist, without complying with the provisions of paragraph
22 3 of subsection B of this section, if:

- 23 a. the dental hygienist has at least two (2) years'
24 experience in the practice of dental hygiene,

- b. the authorization to perform the procedures is in writing and signed by the dentist, and
- c. the procedures are performed during an initial visit to a person in a treatment facility, or pursuant to Section 7 of this act 328.24 or 328.58 of this title.

2. The person upon whom the procedures are performed must be referred to a dentist after completion of the procedures performed pursuant to paragraph 1 of this subsection.

3. A dental hygienist shall not perform a second set of procedures on a person pursuant to this subsection until the person has been examined and accepted for dental care by a dentist.

4. The treatment facility in which any procedure is performed by a dental hygienist pursuant to this subsection shall note each such procedure in the medical records of the person upon whom the procedure was performed and list the dentist that authorized the hygienist to perform the procedures signed by the hygienist.

D. A treatment facility may employ dental hygienists whose services shall be limited to the examination of teeth and the teaching of dental hygiene or as otherwise authorized by the Board.

E. The Board is authorized to prescribe, by rule, the educational requirements for advanced procedures that may be performed by a dental hygienist upon receipt of the advanced procedures designated on his or her license. The advanced procedures shall include the administration of local anesthesia, the

1 administration of nitrous oxide analgesia, neuromodulator
2 administration, therapeutic use of lasers, phlebotomy and
3 venipuncture, and elder care and public health pursuant to Section 7
4 ~~of this act~~ 328.24 or 328.58 of this title.

5 F. A dental hygienist shall not own or operate an independent
6 practice of dental hygiene.

7 G. Nothing in the State Dental Act shall be construed to
8 prohibit a dentist from performing any of the procedures that may be
9 performed by a dental hygienist.

10 H. Nothing in the State Dental Act shall be construed to allow
11 a dental assistant to work under the supervision of a dental
12 hygienist while acting under direct, indirect or general
13 supervision, except as provided by Section ~~7 of this act~~ 328.24 or
14 328.58 of this title.

15 SECTION 14. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 328.54, is
16 amended to read as follows:

17 Section 328.54. A. Any person conducting a diagnosis for the
18 purpose of prescribing medication or treatment or any other action
19 determined to be a dental practice as defined by the State Dental
20 Act, via the Internet or other telecommunications device on any
21 patient that is physically located in this state shall hold a valid
22 Oklahoma state dental license.

23 B. A patient of record may be established by teledentistry for
24 the purposes of an emergency or hygiene treatment if the patient is

1 physically located at the dental office and the dentist is not
2 readily available.

3 C. A dentist holding a valid dental license in Oklahoma may
4 consult, diagnose and treat a patient of record via synchronous or
5 asynchronous telecommunication between the patient and dentist. The
6 dentist must record all activities relating to teledentistry in the
7 patient record and must have an office location in Oklahoma
8 available for follow-up treatment and maintenance of records.

9 SECTION 15. This act shall become effective November 1, 2026.

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
