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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 82 O.S. 2021, Section 1020.19, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	Section 1020.19. Upon request of a majority of the landowners
17	residing within a basin or subbasin, the Board is authorized to
18	require that water wells be metered and that such meters as the
19	Board shall approve be utilized by the applicant and placed under
20	seal, subject to reading by the agents of the Board at any time.
21	The Board may also require that the applicant report the reading of
22	such meters at reasonable intervals
23	A. The Oklahoma Water Resources Board shall require all permit
24	holders authorized to take and use groundwater to implement a system

1	of measuring groundwater usage from all wells associated with the
2	permit. The Board shall determine which measurement systems may be
3	utilized, which shall include, but not be limited to, pump and
4	irrigation monitoring telemetry devices capable of reporting usage.
5	Such measuring systems shall be in proper operating conditions at
6	all times when groundwater is being produced. Data from the
7	measuring system shall be utilized for the annual groundwater use
8	report.
9	B. To encourage groundwater conservation, beginning January 1,
10	2026, the Board shall provide a five-year flex allocation of
11	groundwater usage based off the previously determined allocated
12	annual use of the basin or subbasin. A five-year flex allocation
13	shall not require a new permit for existing permit holders. A five-
14	year flex allocation shall be available for:
15	1. Existing permit holders for groundwater use permits in
16	basins or subbasins, based upon the maximum annual yield
17	determination at the time of the original application;
18	2. New applicants for groundwater use permits in basins or
19	subbasins based upon the current maximum annual yield determination;
20	and
21	3. New and existing applicants and temporary permit holders for
22	groundwater use permits in basins or subbasins where the maximum
23	annual yield has yet to be determined.
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C. An applicant for a five-year flex allocation shall be
required to:
1. Submit an annual usage report of the prior year's usage from
a Board-approved water measurement system; and
2. Pay the annual groundwater permit fee.
D. A five-year flex allocation shall allow the permit holder to
exceed the determined annual allocation in any year of the five-year
allocation; provided, that the applicant shall adhere to the
cumulative annually determined allocation of the basin or subbasin
over the five-year period. The permit holder shall not exceed the
permitted annual allocation by over two hundred percent (200%) in
any of the five (5) years.
E. Nothing in this section shall apply to domestic wells.
SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
