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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 301B of Title 44, unless there
19	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving
21	fund for the Oklahoma Military Department to be designated the "Base
22	Infrastructure Needs and Development - Technology Revolving Fund",
23	which may also be cited as "BIND - Technology Fund". The fund shall
24	be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and

- 1 | shall consist of all monies directed for deposit to the fund by law.
- 2 | All monies accruing to the credit of said fund are hereby
- 3 appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma
- 4 | Military Department for the purpose established in subsection B of
- 5 | this section. Expenditures from said fund shall be made upon
- 6 | warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as
- 7 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and
- 8 | Enterprise Services for approval and payment.
- 9 B. There is hereby established within the Oklahoma Military
- 10 | Department the "Base Infrastructure Needs and Development -
- 11 | Technology Program", which may also be cited as the "BIND -
- 12 | Technology Program". The Department shall utilize funds from the
- 13 | BIND Technology Fund created in subsection A of this section,
- 14 | alone or in combination with other available funding, to make
- 15 | infrastructure investments, including, but not limited to, the
- 16 | purchase of licenses and software associated with military
- 17 | simulation training, that will either:
- 18 | 1. Decrease the likelihood of military base and other military
- 19 infrastructure closures in this state; or
- 20 2. Increase the likelihood of military base and other military
- 21 infrastructure expansions in this state.
- 22 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.
- 23 | SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
- 24 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
