7 An Act relating to health care; prohibiting
8 unauthorized pelvic examinations; providing
9 exceptions; providing for codification; and providing
10 an effective date.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-761 of Title 63, unless there
14 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 A physician, medical student, resident, Advanced Practice
16 Registered Nurse, registered nurse, or physician assistant shall not
17 perform a pelvic examination on an anesthetized or unconscious
18 female patient unless:

19 1. That patient gave informed written consent to the pelvic
20 examination;

21 2. The performance of the pelvic examination is within the
22 scope of care for a surgical procedure or diagnostic examination; or

3. In the case of a patient incapable of giving informed consent, the pelvic examination is required for diagnosis or treatment of such patient.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
