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6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to public safety; directing fire
8 departments to designate an individual to monitor
9 fire site for flare ups and hot spots; clarifying
10 that designee shall be responsible for observing and
11 ensuring the safety of the affected area; clarifying
12 designee does not need to be a fire fighter;
13 requiring designee to monitor sight for certain
14 amount of time; permitting responsibility to be
15 shared; prohibiting fire department from leaving
16 before having a designee; providing for codification;
17 and providing an effective date.

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24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 170 of Title 63, unless there is
created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Any fire department operating within the State of Oklahoma
shall, upon concluding extinguishment efforts at the scene of a
fire, designate an individual to monitor the site for potential
flare-ups or residual hot spots.

B. The designee shall assume responsibility for observing and
ensuring the safety of the affected area.

1 C. The designated individual is not required to be a
2 professional or volunteer firefighter; however, they must have the
3 ability to conduct site inspections at intervals not exceeding one
4 (1) hour for a minimum period of twelve (12) hours following the
5 fire's extinguishment.

6 D. The responsibility for monitoring may be shared among
7 multiple individuals, provided the requirements of subsection C are
8 met.

9 E. The fire department shall leave at least one firefighter at
10 the sight until a designee has been designated.

11 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.

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
