Research Analysis

HB 1018, as introduced, prohibits a pelvic examination from being performed on an anesthetized or unconscious female patient unless the patient has given informed written consent, the examination is within the scope of care for a surgical procedure of diagnostic examination, or in a case in which a patient is incapable of giving informed consent but the pelvic examination is required for diagnosis or treatment.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 1018 prohibits medical professionals from performing pelvic exams on anesthetized or unconscious females unless the patient has previously provided written consent, the exam is part of a surgical procedure or diagnostic exam, or it is necessary for treatment. In its current form, HB 1018 is not expected to have a direct impact on the state budget or appropriations.
