**Research Analysis**

The Senate Amendments to HB 1095 allows the governing body of a city or town to authorize the concealed carry of handguns into any building, or office space except courthouses, courtrooms, prison, jail, detention facilities or other facilities used to hold prisoners. The measure clarifies that a judge may only carry a firearm within the courthouse that falls within the jurisdiction of the judge. The measure clarifies that the county employee may only carry a firearm at locations that fall within the jurisdiction of the county employee. The amendment includes municipal judges as persons who may be approved by the city council to carry firearms in the performance of their duties only in municipal buildings that fall within the jurisdiction of the elected official, municipal judge, or municipal employee.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The CS to HB1095 allows certain municipalities to authorize the concealed carry of handguns in certain instances. In its current form, this measure is not anticipated to have a material impact on state budget or appropriations.

The FA1 to HB1095 clarifies the various persons and circumstances to which provisions of the act shall apply to. This does not change the fiscal impact of the measure.

The SAHB does not change the fiscal impact of the measure as described above.
