**Research Analysis**

The subcommittee recommendation for HB 2011 creates the "Fighting Chance for Firefighters Act," which authorizes state cancer centers to carry out the purposes and functions of the act to cover the costs of occupational cancer screenings. The measure also authorizes the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to extend the benefits of the Oklahoma Employees Insurance and Benefits Plans to municipal and county fire departments.

**Fiscal Analysis**

In its current form, HB 2011 creates the "Fighting Chance for Firefighters Act" and authorizes the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to extend the benefits of the Oklahoma Employees Insurance and Benefits Plan to municipal and county fire departments.

The Fighting Chance for Firefighters Act allows state cancer centers to carry out the purposes and functions of the act to cover the costs of occupational cancer screenings.

This measure is not expected to directly impact state revenue or state appropriations.
