Research Analysis

The proposed policy committee substitute for HB 2152 changes the gross annual sales cap for home food establishments from \$75,000 to \$150,000. It also includes that incidental sales of raw milk can be made directly to consumers under the provisions of the Homemade Food Freedom Act.

HB 2152 raises the gross annual sales of a business that qualifies as a home food establishment from \$75,000 annually to \$150,000 annually. The measure removes the prohibition on using unpasteurized milk in homemade food products and requires that if the product consists of unpasteurized milk that the label and the placard indicate as such.

Fiscal Analysis

The proposed committee substitute to HB 2152 modifies the statutory definitions of "home food establishment" and "homemade food product" as well as requires homemade food products consisting of or containing unpasteurized milk to have a label disclosing such information. Upon review, this measure has no direct fiscal or revenue considerations for the state.
